LORD LIEUTENANT-GENERAL AND GENERAL GOVERNOR OF IRELAND.

Queen's University, Dublin Castle, June 1, 1878.

May it please your Grace,

As Chancellor of the Queen's University in Ireland, it becomes my duty, in compliance with the provisions of Her Majesty's Charter, to furnish to your Grace the Report of the Condition and Progress of the University since the 1st June, 1877.

The General University Examinations during the period of this Report commenced on the 19th of September, and terminated on the 9th of October, 1877. Examinations for Degrees in the Faculty of Medicine were also held in June, 1877, and First University Examinations in Arts and Engineering were also held in January, 1878. At these various Examinations 626* Candidates presented themselves. Lists of those who were successful are App. II. annexed, and a List of the Students Matriculated in the University since the 1st of October last.

In addition to these Examinations for Members of the University, Examinations of Candidates who are not Members of the University, both Male and Female, were held in the month of June, 1877.

The principal public meeting of the University, to confer degrees and diplomas, and distribute prizes, was held in St. Patrick's

Public Meeting of the Queen's University in Ireland, held in $_{\text{Public}}^{\text{I.}}$ St. Patrick's Hall, Dublin Castle, on the 12th October, 1877. $_{\text{Meeting.}}^{\text{I.}}$

After the close of the Examinations of the year 1877, a public meeting of the Queen's University was held in Dublin Castle on the 12th October, for conferring degrees, diplomas, and prizes.

A large number of distinguished persons having taken their places in the Examination Hall, His Grace the Duke of Leinster, Chancellor of the University, the Senate, the Professors and Examiners, and the Candidates, entered it in procession.

HIS GRACE THE DUKE OF LEINSTER, Chancellor of the University, opened the meeting with the following address:—

During the past year 831 students were taught in the Queen's Colleges. of whom 208 were members of the Protestant Episcopal Church of Ireland, 214 Roman Catholics, 325 Presbyterians, and 84 of other denominations; 237 students attended lectures in the Faculty of Arts, 527 in that of Medicine, 32 in the Faculty of Law, and 45 in the Department of Engineering. Of the three University examinations held in the year—in January, in June, and in Autumn—the principal examinations are those which have just concluded. The printed lists contain the names of all the candidates who have passed the University examinations during the academic year. In the Faculty of Arts 18 candidates passed the examination for the Degree of Master in Arts, 15 of whom were deemed worthy of University honors; 46 candidates presented themselves for the degree of Bachelor in Arts, of whom 42 have satisfied the examiners; and of these 20 have been considered deserving of University distinctions; 57 candidates presented themselves at the first University Examination in Arts; and of these 45 have passed, 12 of them with honors. In the Faculty of Law two Bachelors in Arts presented themselves for the degree of Bachelor in Laws, both of whom are reported by the examiners as having answered with distinction; and two candidates for the degree of Doctor in Laws have satisfied the examiners. In the Faculty of Medicine 72 candidates have sought the degree of Doctors in Medicine, and of these 44 have satisfied the examiners. 35 candidates out of 58 have passed for the degree of Master of Surgery; and 25 out of 43 have been deemed qualified for the diploma in midwifery. 115 candidates presented themselves at the second University Examination in Medicine, of whom 73 have satisfied the examiners; and 154 out of 198 candidates have been successful at the first University Examination in the same faculty. In the department of Civil Engineering 8 candidates presented themselves for the degree of Bachelors in Engineering, of whom 6 satisfied the examiners; and 7 candidates presented themselves for the first University Examination in the same department, of whom 6 have passed. In the case of Mr. William Whitla the examiners have added a special report, calling the attention of the Senate to the unusual excellence of his

Appendix. answering. The examiners also called the attention of the Senate to the excellent answering of Mr. J. W. Macnamara and Mr. William Macna-It may be interesting to state the numbers of degrees in each of the three faculties-Arts, Law, and Medicine, and in the department of Engineering, which have been conferred since the opening of the University. Including those which are to be conferred on the present occasion the numbers are as follows :- Bachelors of Arts, 956; Masters in Arts, 304; Bachelors in Law, 51; Doctors in Law, 19; Doctors in Medicine. 822; Masters in Surgery, 426; Bachelors in Engineering, 158. It is, of course, impossible to follow the great mass of our graduates into their private occupations and pursuits, so as to form an estimate of how much of their success in life may be attributed to their university training: but there can be no doubt that they now form a large and widely diffused body of growing influence in our social system. With respect to distinctions obtained by our students outside the university we have no means of collecting complete statistics; those of our alumni, however, who win for themselves positions in the public service, or in other public institutions, may, in many cases, be referred to, and the result may justly be pronounced satisfactory; and in the various departments of the public service at home and abroad our graduates are now found in places of trust and importance. We have this year to lament the loss which the University has sustained in the death of Mr. Berwick, late President of Queen's College, Galway. Mr. Berwick's abilities, energy, and large and liberal views on education were amply proved by the part he took in organizing the system of the Queen's University, and he was a wise and faithful administrator of the College, with which he was, from its foundation, connected.

SIR MICHAEL HICKS-BEACH said-

Your Grace, Mr. Vice-Chancellor, ladies, and gentlemen, in reply to the invitation which your Grace has addressed to me, I will venture to say a very few words of thanks for the kindly way in which you have received my presence as a guest-not for the first time-upon the occasion which crowns your University year. I can assure you that in doing so I shall attempt to avoid entirely all matters of political controversy. This is not the time or the place to discuss rival theories of Irish University education. Nor will I venture to criticise, because, in the presence of so many men of learning and science, who have devoted their lives to the work of your University, criticism would indeed, in my case, be a dangerous task. Much less shall I attempt to lecture upon the character of their future life those younger members of the Queen's University who have already shown themselves possessed of ability, perseverance, capability to acquire knowledge, and other qualities, which are so certain, when fully developed, to insure them complete I would prefer to speak to you as a University man to I have a vivid and a very pleasant recollection of my University men. own life at Oxford. I can remember the interest which attached to that life—I can remember successes and failures in its course; and from it I hope I learnt to appreciate something of the advantages of that education which this, a sister University has afforded to you. think that that affords a stronger and a closer bond of sympathy between us than can be found in the chance that I happen to be a member of the Government, and that your University and its colleges were founded and have been largely maintained by public funds; because it is well for all of us to do what we can to disassociate University education from Government patronage and control. I believe

that such patronage and control may be carried to an extent which will Appendix. choke the very life blood of a University. Your University and its colleges were founded by Government, and are, as I have said largely Public maintained by funds voted by Parliament; but I am happy to think Meeting. that you are really self-governing, and I believe it will be well when the day arrives when that self-government not only exists in reality—as it does now-but when even the symbols of connexion with the Government may be cast away. There may be reasons which may make it agreeable to you to meet on such occasion as this in a hall possessing such famous memories as that in which we now stand; but I sympathize myself heartily with the wish that has been recently expressed at your convocation, that the day may soon come when, for all purposes of its work and ceremonials, the Queen's University may possess buildings of its own, adequate for their purpose, and such as may place it on a level with other institutions in the United Kingdom; because I think you need not be afraid to stand simply and solely on your own merits. In the learned professions, in law, medicine, and engineering, the Queen's University graduates are capable of holding their own. In those competitions for appointments in the service of the country which are now so thoroughly the fashion we not only find that Irishmen are able, I fear to do more than hold their own in comparison with the natives of the sister kingdoms, but that this University provides no small proportion of the successful candidates. I think the local influence of your colleges is no less useful. They are the centres, as it were, of enlightenment and science in the principal towns of Ireland, where otherwise, perhaps, the requirements of commercial life might stifle the leaning of the population towards higher education. Some inhabitants of these towns -of Cork and Belfast at any rate-have shown recently, I believe, their sense of the usefulness of those institutions by providing munificent gifts towards their maintenance and improvement. All this is due, ladies and gentlemen, not to any action of the Government, but to honest and patient work on the part of those who are entrusted with the governing and teaching of the College. I do not in this express merely my own opinion. I could refer to the views which have been expressed to me by what I may call the highest possible authority upon such a subject. You are aware that not very long ago certain gentlemen visited your colleges as Government Commissioners in order to inquire into various matters connected with them. Two of those Commissioners—Mr. Osborne Gordon and Dr. Allman—are known throughout England and Scotland as eminent University men. one who knows Oxford will know the work Mr. Gordon has done for years past, not only as senior tutor of the largest college in that University, but in assisting in the Government of the University itself. Dr. Allman's name is well known to all who have followed the history of the Scotch Universities. These gentlemen, after a patient and careful investigation, expressed almost astonishment to me at its results. spoke of the professors, not merely of those among them whose names are known to the world, but of the professors as a body, as thoroughly able, efficient, and zealous in their work. They alluded to the teaching of the colleges as excellent, to its results as successful, and, I am happy to add, when referring to Galway College—a college, perhaps, whose circumstances are not so fortunate as those of its larger sisters-they said it was in nothing behind Belfast or Cork.

Well, I think that that was a result that cannot be but satisfactory to all who take an interest in the Queen's University, and to all University men. I trust and believe that the work that is done now

Appendix. will continue, and that we may be able to adopt such measures as may, perhaps, increase its efficiency in the future. You must not suppose that because in some important points the Government have not as yet taken action upon the report of the Commission to which I have alluded that, therefore, that report has been forgotten. It has been the subject of careful attention and of discussion-important portions of it, at least—at the Councils of the Colleges, and it has been because the Government are anxious to follow, as far as they can, the recommendations of the Commission, and yet to reconcile them with the views of the Councils of the Colleges, that some delay has taken place in dealing with these recommendations. I hope that this will not long continue. We have but very recently seen an instance of the effect that may be produced by the insufficient incomes of the professors of the Queen's Colleges. I think that all who know anything of Galway College will regret, for the sake of that College, that the Professor of Anatomy and Physiology is about to leave it. I feel sure that all who know that professor will sympathize with him in the merited fortune that has befallen him, and congratulate the University that has secured his services. But what we want, gentlemen, is to retain the services of our eminent professors for the Queen's Colleges, and it is with that view, and not merely with regard to individual interests, that this question has been considered, and I hope will soon be satisfactorily dealt with. I have to thank you, ladies and gentlemen, for the kindness and patience with which you have listened to me. I have little to add to what I have already said. I feel sure that I may venture to congratulate you upon the present condition of the Queen's University and its colleges. I believe, as I have said, that the work which has been done is good, and in that fact I think that those who are anxious to meddle with the University question in Ireland may find something worthy their consideration. I do not know why the destruction of something or other should be necessarily a part of the creed of University reformers; I do not know why institutions, meeting the wants of a considerable number of the people, doing with limited means proportionately more work, and that among poorer classes, than kindred institutions in England-I do not know why such institutions should not I believe that the future of the Queen's Colleges is in be maintained. the hands of their graduates and of their teachers. I would leave it to their graduates to show that they, in their future lives, prove themselves worthy of the teaching which they have received. I would leave it to the professors, with equal confidence, to maintain and complete the work in which they are engaged, and thus, by this honest and patient labour, of which we have such proofs, to retain and deserve the support and the confidence of the people.
