- W**H **H**EREA **S** it is expedient to make provision for the better Regulation of the several Hospitals, Dispensaries, Asylums and other Medical Charities, supported solely or in part by public funds, now existing, or which may hereafter be required, in Ireland ;
- 5 **B**E it therefore **E**nacted, by The **Q**UEEN's most **E**xcellent **M**AJESTY, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, **T**HAT it shall and may be lawful to and for the Lord Lieutenant, or other Chief Governor or Governors of
- 10 Ireland for the time being, to nominate and appoint Four experienced Medical Men, well acquainted with the regulation and management of Hospitals and Dispensaries, and Three discreet and proper persons to constitute a Board of Commissioners for the general control, superintendence and regulation of all Hospitals, Asylums, Dispensaries,
- 15 Infirmaries or other Medical Charities in Ireland, and from time to time, at his and their pleasure, to remove such persons so appointed ; and in case of the death, removal or retirement of any such medical or other person, to appoint some other medical or other person in his stead ; and such Seven Persons shall perform all the duties
- 20 prescribed for the Commissioners of Medical Charities as directed by this Act : Provided always, That no such Commissioner being a medical person, shall hold any appointment in any such Hospital,

Asylum, Dispensary, Infirmary or other Medical Charity, and that the said Commissioners shall act without any salary, fee, reward or emolument whatsoever; save and except One of such Commissioners, being a medical man, who shall be paid the salary hereinafter provided.

And be it Enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the Com- 5
missioners so to be appointed for the forming such Board of Medical
Charities, or any Five of them, to meet and sit from time to time in
such place or places as they shall find most convenient, with or without
adjournment; and to have an office in the city of Dublin, to be
called "The Medical Charity Office;" and they shall and may, with 10
the consent and approbation of the Lord Lieutenant, or other Chief
Governor or Governors of Ireland, employ such Secretary, being
a Physician or Surgeon, and such clerks and officers as they may find
necessary; and that all and every the persons so employed in any such
capacity shall be paid and allowed such salary as the said Lord 15
Lieutenant or other Chief Governor or Governors shall appoint and
direct; and may from time to time, with the like consent and appro-
bation, be dismissed by the said Commissioners, and any other person
or persons, appointed in like manner in his and their stead.

And be it Enacted, That the said Commissioners shall and they are 20
hereby authorized and required to inquire, by means of the Inspectors
appointed under the provisions of this Act or otherwise, into the ma-
nagement of every Hospital, Asylum, Infirmary, Dispensary or other
Medical Charity in Ireland, supported solely or in part by public funds,
and to require from all persons in whom any estate, property or funds 25
belonging to or held in trust for any such Hospital, Asylum, Infirmary
or other Medical Charity shall be vested, or who shall be in the
receipt of the rents, profits or income of any such estate, property or
funds, a true account, in writing, of the place where such estate may
be situate, or in what mode or on what security such other property or 30
funds may be invested, with such detail of the rents, profits and
income thereof, and the appropriation of the same, and of all other par-
ticulars relating thereto, as the said Commissioners shall think fit; and
that the said Commissioners may, from time to time, as they may see fit,
make and issue all such orders as they shall think proper for enforcing 35
obedience to or conformity with the statutes, charters, deeds of
foundation or endowment, wills of donors or bye-laws, by which any
such Hospital, Asylum, Infirmary, Dispensary or other Medical Charity
as aforesaid, should by law be governed, and with the lawful objects
and purposes of its foundation; and in case that any inspector ap- 40
pointed under the provisions of this Act shall report to the said Com-
missioners that any such Hospital, Asylum, Infirmary, Dispensary, or
other Medical Charity, shall not respectively have the number of
Governors,

Governors, or Directors, or Committees, specified and set forth in the Schedule (A.) to this Act annexed, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners to appoint such additional governors or directors, or committees, for the government of every such Hospital, Asylum, Infirmary, Dispensary or other Medical Charity, as shall be requisite to make up the number respectively specified for every such Hospital, Asylum, Infirmary, Dispensary or other Medical Charity, in the said Schedule, or any such lesser number as the said Commissioners may deem necessary for the prevention of any conflict between the objects and purposes of any such institution and the provisions of any Act to be passed in this Session of Parliament, or in any future Session, for the relief of the poor in Ireland.

AND whereas it is expedient that the said Commissioners should be empowered to inquire into the management of Medical Charities in Ireland, supported solely or in part by bequests; BE it therefore Enacted, That the said Commissioners shall and they are hereby authorized and required, by means of the said Inspectors or otherwise, to examine into the amount, nature and application of all estates and funds, of what nature or kind soever, and the produce thereof, destined or intended to be applied to the purpose or support of any Medical Charity or Charities in Ireland, or held under trusts created for such charitable use or purpose, and to examine into and investigate all breaches of trust, irregularities, frauds, abuses, or supposed abuses, or misconduct, in relation to and in the management or appropriation or non-appropriation or misappropriation of such estates and funds; and the said Commissioners shall from time to time report and certify, in writing, under their hands and seals, to The QUEEN's most Excellent Majesty the proceedings touching the amount, nature, management, application and appropriation of such of the aforesaid estates and funds as they shall have inquired and examined into, and also what is the nature of such estates and funds respectively, and the actual annual produce thereof, and what is the actual annual value thereof, and in whose possession, as tenants thereof, any part thereof, consisting of lands, tenements or hereditaments, shall be, adding at the same time such observations as shall occur to them respecting such mode as they shall deem most effectual for the recovering of such part or parts of such estates or funds as shall appear to them to have been applied in breach of the trust created in respect of the same, or shall appear to have been omitted to be applied in pursuance of such trust, and subjoining such suggestions as may seem to them expedient, respecting the most effectual mode of securing such estates and funds, and their respective produce, against any future misapplication thereof, together with such general suggestions as may appear to them most expedient for the recovery, management and application of such bequests.

And be it Enacted, That whenever any extract from the enrolment of any charter or deed, or from any decree, report, record, or

other document whatever, deposited or remaining in any of the offices belonging to or under the control of the Courts of Chancery or Exchequer, or in any public registry, shall be required, for the purposes of this Act, by any order signed by one of the Commissioners under this Act, the officer or officers having the custody of such enrolment, decree, report, record, or other document, shall furnish an extract of so much only as shall be so required of any such enrolment, decree, report, record, or other document, and that any such extract, or any copy which shall be required for the purposes of this Act, by any order signed by one of the said Commissioners, of any such enrolment, decree, report, record, or other document, shall not be subject or liable to the payment of any stamp duty or other charge whatever any law, statute or usage to the contrary in anywise notwithstanding.

And be it Enacted, That it shall and may be lawful to and for the Lord Lieutenant, or other chief Governor or Governors of Ireland for the time being, to nominate and appoint Four Physicians or Surgeons, being Fellows, Members, Licentiates or medical Graduates of one of the Royal Colleges of Physicians or Surgeons, or chartered Universities of Great Britain or Ireland, to be Inspectors of Hospitals, Infirmaries, Asylums, Dispensaries and other Medical Charities in Ireland; and from time to time, at his and their pleasure, to remove any such Physician or Surgeon so appointed; and in case of the death, removal or resignation of any such Physician or Surgeon, to appoint some other Physician or Surgeon in his stead; and such Four Persons shall perform all the duties prescribed for the Medical Inspectors as directed by this Act.

And be it Enacted, That each of the said Inspectors, and such one of the said Commissioners, being a Physician or Surgeon, as the said Lord Lieutenant or other Chief Governor or Governors shall think fit, shall receive such salary as the Lord Lieutenant, or other Chief Governor or Governors of Ireland, shall appoint, not exceeding to each the sum of Six hundred Pounds in the year, together with such allowance for travelling and expenses of office as shall be sanctioned by the Lord High Treasurer, or Commissioners of the Treasury, which salary and allowance, together with the salary and allowance for any Secretary, Clerks or Officers appointed under the provisions of this Act, shall be payable in quarterly payments out of the Consolidated Fund of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

And be it Enacted, That each of the said Inspectors and the said paid Medical Commissioner, and the said Secretary, shall, previously to his entering upon the duties of his office, respectively take the following oath before any of the Judges of any of Her Majesty's Courts of

of Record at Dublin, which oath the said Judges are hereby respectively authorized and required to administer; (that is to say)

“ I, A. B., do swear, that, according to the best of my skill and judgment, I will faithfully, impartially and truly execute the several powers and trusts vested in me by an Act of intituled [*here insert the title of this Act*, according to the true intent and meaning of the same.”

And be it Enacted, That no such Inspector or paid Medical Commissioner shall be attached to, or in anywise connected with, any Hospital, Gaol, Infirmary, Asylum, Dispensary, or other Medical Charity, or with any School of Medicine, Surgery or Pharmacy, or other Medical Institution whatsoever, or in any way engaged in or connected with the sale of drugs, or practise as a Physician, Surgeon or Apothecary, or be an Inspector of places where anatomy is carried on, or derive from the performance of any duty imposed on him by this Act any other emolument than the salary and allowance hereinbefore provided; and that each such Inspector shall have been in possession of a diploma, as hereinbefore provided, for Seven Years at the least prior to his being so appointed.

And be it Enacted, That the said Inspectors may attend and transact the business of their office from time to time, as they shall find most convenient, at the Medical Charity Office, and may employ such Secretary, Clerks and Officers as are appointed or employed by the Board of Commissioners of Medical Charities to assist them in examining, auditing and arranging the statements, reports, returns and accounts transmitted to the Medical Charities Office by the Governors, Directors or Committees of the several Hospitals, Infirmarys, Asylums, Dispensaries and other Medical Charities, and in preparing the reports of the state of every such institution to be laid before the Commissioners of Medical Charities, and the abstracts and summaries of returns and expenditures to be laid before Parliament.

And be it Enacted, That the said Inspectors shall be Inspectors of all Lunatic Asylums in Ireland, and shall have all the same powers and authorities in that behalf as by any Acts now in force relating to Prisons or district Lunatic Asylums are given to the Inspectors-General of Prisons; and the authority of such Inspectors-General of Prisons in respect of such Lunatic Asylums shall cease and determine from and after the appointment of the said Inspectors under this Act; and copies of all reports required to be made by such Inspectors to the Lord Lieutenant respecting such Lunatic Asylums shall be transmitted by them to the Commissioners of Medical Charities.

And be it Enacted, That every Hospital, Asylum, Dispensary or other Medical Charity supported solely or in part by public funds in Ireland, or such other Medical Institutions there as the said Commissioners shall direct, in conformity with the powers conferred on the said Commissioners by this Act, shall be inspected Twice at the least in every year by One or more of the said Inspectors, who shall report upon the state of every such institution to the Commissioners of Medical Charities in Dublin: Provided always, That not less than Four or more than Six Months shall intervene between each such inspection.

And be it Enacted, That on or before the Twentieth day of January One thousand eight hundred and Thirty-nine, and on or before the Twentieth day of January in each succeeding year, the Governors, Directors or Committees of the several Hospitals, Infirmarys, Asylums, Dispensaries or other Medical Charities in Ireland, supported solely or in part by public funds, or the Treasurer or other proper officer of every such institution respectively, shall yearly and every year make out and deliver or transmit to the Commissioners of Medical Charities in Dublin, a return containing a statement and account of all the funds intrusted to the Governors, Directors or Committees of every such institution respectively for the benefit of every such institution, and of the application of such funds for the year ending on the Thirty-first day of December preceding such Twentieth day of January, with the balances of the debts and credits, and of the whole funds of every such institution respectively on every Thirty-first day of December, and the number of persons who have received advice or medical aid therein or therefrom during such year, and the number of Patients remaining therein at the time of such return, and the number and names of the Surgeons, Physicians, Apothecaries, Officers, Servants and other persons employed in or about the management of every such institution respectively, together with an estimate of the amount which will probably be required for the maintenance throughout the year, commencing from the said Thirty-first day of December, of such institutions respectively, in which estimate shall be stated, in detail, all expenses that will probably be incurred, whether for buildings, repairs, provisions, medicines, salaries or other expenses incidental to such institutions; and shall transmit such estimate to the said Commissioners of Medical Charities, with all such other matters and things relating to the management, revenue and expenditure of every such institution respectively as shall from time to time be required by the said Commissioners of Medical Charities for the full disclosure of the state of every such institution respectively; and the said returns, statements and accounts shall be signed by the Secretary, Treasurer, or chief officer for the time being of every such institution respectively, and shall be certified as correct statements by at

at least Three of the Governors, Directors or Committee of every such institution respectively.

And be it Enacted, That a half-yearly return of the state of disease in each district, and of the number of Patients to whom medical aid has been administered in or by each of the institutions aforesaid, shall be transmitted to the said Commissioners of Medical Charities, certified by the signature or signatures of the Medical Officer or Officers attached to each such institution, and a general abstract and summary of such returns, together with a general abstract and summary of the expenditure upon each class of the Medical Charities aforesaid, and of the proceedings of the said Commissioners with respect to such institutions, shall be laid before Parliament by the Commissioners of Medical Charities in each year during its sitting.

And be it Enacted, That the said Commissioners of Medical Charities to be from time to time appointed under this Act, shall have and exercise all such powers for the obtaining the accounts, statements and returns by this Act required to be made, relating to the said institutions, or any of them, and in the examining and stating the receipt and expenditure, and of the debts and credits of every such institution respectively, and of compelling all persons to whose orders or care any money for the benefit of the said institutions, or any of them, shall be or shall have been issued or entrusted to account to them the said Commissioners for the receipt, expenditure or issue of the same, and of doing and enforcing all such other matters and things as the said Commissioners are authorized or required to do under the provisions of this Act, as are given to or vested in the Commissioners for auditing the Public Accounts, under and by virtue of an Act passed in the fifty-second year of the reign of his Majesty King GEORGE the Third, intituled, "An Act to provide for the speedy and regular Examination and Audit of the Public Accounts of Ireland, and to repeal certain former Acts relating thereto," with respect to the matters and things required to be done by the said Commissioners of Accounts under the said recited Act.

And be it Enacted, That from and after the first day of May One thousand eight hundred and Forty, every person shall be capable of being elected or appointed Surgeon to any Infirmary, Hospital, Asylum, Dispensary or any other Medical Charity, in Ireland, who shall have previously obtained letters testimonial of his qualification to practise Surgery from the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland, or who shall have obtained the diploma of the Royal College of Surgeons of London, or of the Royal College of Surgeons in Edinburgh, or a degree or diploma in Surgery from some other College, University or Body in Great Britain or Ireland, duly authorized by Royal Charter or Statute to grant the same : Provided always, That such person shall prove and show, to the satisfaction of the said Commissioners of

Medical Charities, by such letters testimonial, diploma, or degree or diploma, or by such other certificate or certificates, obtained from such College, University or body as aforesaid, that he has pursued such course of education and been subjected to such examinations at the least as are specified in the Schedule (B.) to this Act annexed, or as the same may be altered under the provisions hereinafter contained. 5

Provided always, and be it Enacted, That nothing herein contained shall extend or be construed to extend to limit or restrain any such College, University or Body as aforesaid, from making such additions 10 to the course of the education of Candidates for such diplomas or degrees, and to subject such Candidates to such additional examinations as such College, University or body shall, from the improved state of the profession, from time to time see fit; but that such Schedule shall be held to contain the minimum course of 15 education and of examinations to be required to be undergone by Surgeons to Irish Medical Charities, unless the same shall be altered by the said Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland, Royal College of Surgeons of London, and Royal College of Surgeons in Edinburgh, or a majority of them respectively. 20

And be it Enacted, That every person shall be capable of being elected Physician to any of the aforesaid Charitable Institutions who shall have obtained the license or letters testimonial of the King and Queen's College of Physicians in Ireland, or the diploma, license or degree in medicine of some other College or University in 25 Great Britain or Ireland, duly authorized by Royal Charter or Statute to grant the same.

And be it Enacted, That from and after the said first day of May One thousand eight hundred and Forty, no person shall be capable of being elected, appointed or employed as Surgeon or Physician to any 30 Hospital, Asylum, Infirmary, Dispensary or other Medical Charity, unless he shall previously have obtained a Certificate under the hands of the Commissioners of Medical Charities, that he is duly qualified as aforesaid, and that he has obtained the letters testimonial, or the diploma or degree and certificates required by this Act. 35

And be it Enacted, That nothing in this Act contained shall extend or apply to any Member or Licentiate of the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland, or to any Fellow or Licentiate of the King and Queen's College of Physicians in Ireland, or to any Fellow, Member, Licentiate or Graduate of any other College, University or body, who shall be, on the 40 said first day of May One thousand eight hundred and Forty, Surgeon or Physician to any Hospital, Infirmary or Asylum, or Dispensary or other Medical Charitable Institution in Ireland, or who now is or shall be, at

at any time before the said first day of May One thousand eight hundred and Forty, eligible to be elected or appointed to any such Infirmary, Hospital, Dispensary, Asylum, or other Medical Institution, but that all such persons shall continue to possess and enjoy all their rights, privileges or eligibilities, in as full and ample a manner, to all intents and purposes, as if this Act had not been passed.

And be it Enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for any body corporate or collegiate, civil or ecclesiastical, aggregate or sole, to demise any lands within the Kingdom of Ireland to the Governors Trustees or other proper officers, of any Public Hospital or Hospitals within the said Kingdom, for the use of such Hospital or Hospitals, or for forming a Cemetery to belong thereto, for any term of years, or for life or lives certain, or lives renewable at the best yearly rent that can then be obtained for the same, and subject to such covenants, conditions and provisos as shall be agreed upon between the said lessors and lessees ; and in every such lease there shall be reserved a power of re-entry on non-payment of the rent reserved within a reasonable time after the same shall become due and payable ; and every such lease shall be good, valid and effectual against every person having, or claiming to have, any charge or encumbrance affecting either in law or equity the lands or premises comprised therein : Provided always, That no such lease shall demise a greater quantity than Thirty Acres, and that no fine shall be taken or received for making such lease or demise.

And be it Enacted, That the said Commissioners shall and may receive and send by the General Post from and to places within the United Kingdom all letters and packets relating solely and exclusively to the execution of this Act, free from the duty of postage, provided that such letters and packets as shall be sent to the said Commissioners shall be directed to the " Commissioners of Medical Charities," at their office in Dublin, and that all such letters and packets as shall be sent by the said Commissioners shall be in covers, with the words " Office of Commissioners of Medical Charities" printed on the same, and be signed on the outside thereof under such words, with the name of such person as the said Commissioners, with the consent of the Commissioners of the Treasury, or any Three or more of them, shall authorize and appoint in his own handwriting (such name to be from time to time transmitted to the Secretaries of the General Post Office in London and Dublin), and under such other regulations and restrictions as the said Commissioners, or any Three or more of them, shall think proper and direct, and the person so to be authorized is hereby strictly forbidden so to subscribe any letter or packet whatsoever, except such only concerning which he shall receive the special direction of his superior officer, or which he shall

shall himself know to relate solely and exclusively to the execution of this Act; and if the person so to be authorized, or any other person, shall send, or cause or permit to be sent, under any such cover any letter, paper or writing, or any enclosure other than what shall relate to the execution of this Act, every person so offending shall be dismissed 5 from his office, and shall forfeit and pay the sum of One hundred Pounds, one Moiety of the said penalty to the use of Her Majesty, Her heirs and successors, and the other Moiety to the use of the person who shall inform or sue for the same, to be sued for and recovered in any of Her Majesty's Courts of Record at Dublin; and if any paper 10 or writing or other enclosure shall be sent under cover to the said Commissioners, the same not relating solely and exclusively to the execution of this Act, they are hereby strictly required and enjoined to transmit the same forthwith to the Secretary of the Post Office in Dublin, with the covers under which the same shall be sent, in order 15 that the contents thereof may be charged with the full rates of postage.

General Issue.

And be it Enacted, That any action or suit which shall be brought against any Commissioner or Commissioners to be appointed under the authority of this Act, or against any person or persons acting under the authority or by the order of such Commissioners, or any one 20 or more of them, for any thing done or acted by him or them under this Act, shall be commenced within Six calendar Months next after the fact committed in respect of which such action or suit shall be brought or commenced, and not afterwards; and the defendant or defendants in every such action or suit may plead the General Issue, 25 and give this Act and the special matter in evidence at any trial to be had thereupon; and if such action or suit shall be brought or commenced after the time so limited for bringing the same, then the jury shall find a verdict for the defendant or defendants; and in such case, or if the jury shall find a verdict for the defendant or defend- 30 ants upon the merits, or if the plaintiff or plaintiffs shall become non-suit, or discontinue his, her or their action after appearance, or if upon demurrer, judgment shall be given against the plaintiff or plaintiffs, the defendant or defendants shall have Treble costs, which he or they shall or may recover in such and the same manner as any defendant 35 can by law in other cases.

SCHEDULES TO WHICH THIS ACT REFERS.

SCHEDULE (A.)

Specifying the Number of GOVERNORS, or DIRECTORS, or COMMITTEES, proper for the Government and Management of the several Medical Charities in Ireland.

For every Hospital, Asylum, Infirmary, Dispensary or other Medical Charity in Ireland, containing Fifty Beds or upwards, Thirty-one Governors, or Directors, or Members of Committee.

For every Hospital, Asylum, Infirmary, Dispensary or other Medical Charity in Ireland, containing any lesser number of Beds than Fifty; and for every Hospital, Asylum, Infirmary, Dispensary or other Medical Charity in Ireland, which shall not afford accommodation for intern Patients, Fifteen Governors or Directors or Members of Committee.

SCHEDULE (B.)

Specifying the QUALIFICATIONS required for CANDIDATES for the appointment of Surgeon to any Hospital, Asylum, Infirmary, Dispensary, or other Medical Charity in Ireland.

1. Proof of a suitable preliminary Education.
2. " " professional Study in a recognized School or Schools of Surgery, for not less than Three Years (it being understood that Three Months of Vacation shall be allowed in each year), and in the event of absence or absences from such School or Schools during such term of Three Years (exclusive of the Vacations) that the full term shall be completed in a corresponding portion of any subsequent year.
3. " " attendance for at least Twenty-one Months upon an Hospital or Hospitals, in which Clinical Instruction is constantly proceeding.
4. " " attendance upon Lectures on Anatomy and Physiology, during at least Two Courses of Six Months each.
- " " having performed Dissections during at least Two Winter Sessions.
- " " having attended Lectures on Surgery during at least Two Courses of Six Months each.
- " " " " " Chemistry, during at least One Course of Six Months.
- " " " " " Practice of Physic, during at least One Course of Six Months.
- " " " " " Midwifery - - ditto - - ditto.
- " " " " " Materia Medica, including Botany, ditto, ditto.
- " " " " " Medical Jurisprudence, during One Course of not fewer than Twenty-five Lectures.
- " " having undergone an examination in Surgery, Anatomy, Physiology and Pathology.
- " " " " an examination in Medicine, Pharmacy and Midwifery by one of the Royal Colleges of Surgeons in Ireland, of London or in Edinburgh respectively, or by some Corporation or body specially authorized by Charter or Statute to hold such examination.
