Confirm two Provisional Orders made by the Local Govern- A.D. 1892. ment Board for Ireland under "The Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878," relating to the Purchase of Land for Burial Grounds in the Poor Law Union of Sligo.

TATHEREAS the Local Government Board for Ireland have made the Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereto, under the provisions of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878:

41 & 42 Viet. c. 52.

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be 5 confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1. The Orders set out in the schedule hereto shall be and the Order in 10 same are hereby confirmed, and shall be construed as part of this schedule Act, and all the provisions thereof shall have full validity and force.
- 2. This Act may be cited as the Local Government Board Short title. 15 (Ireland) Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 2) Act, 1892.

THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD FOR IRELAND.

TAWNAGH BURIAL GROUND.

PROVISIONAL ORDER.

WHEREAS the Guardians of the Poor of the Sligo Union (herein-after 5 called the Burial Board) are the Burial Board of the Rural Sanitary District consisting of the said Union, except the part thereof included in any Urban Sanitary District, and propose to take the lands and premises herein-after mentioned to be used as a burial ground in addition to the burial ground at Tawnagh in the said Rural Sanitary District, and the said lands and premises are not within one hundred yards of any dwelling house and otherwise fulfil all conditions required by the statute in that behalf.

And whereas the Burial Board have presented a petition to the Local Government Board for Ireland (herein-after called the Local Government Board), in pursuance of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, praying that 15 the Burial Board may be allowed to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts, with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement with reference to the said lands and premises.

And whereas the Burial Board have deposited in the office of the Local Government Board in Dublin plans and a book of reference (herein-after 20 called the deposited plans and book of reference), showing and describing the said lands and premises.

And whereas all advertisements and notices required by the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, having been previously duly published, served and given, the Local Government Board have caused a local inquiry to be made as to the 25 propriety of assenting to the prayer of the said petition, and it appears to be proper to assent thereto.

It is ordered by the Local Government Board as follows:-

Compulsory powers to take land.

- 1. From and after the confirmation of this Order by Parliament, the Burial Board shall be empowered to put in force the powers of 30 the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement with reference to the lands and premises shown and described in the deposited plans and book of reference, that is to say: All that part of the lands of Tawnagh immediately adjacent to the present burial ground of Tawnagh containing 35 one rood statute measure or thereabouts.
- No part of the said additional burial ground shall be made within three hundred yards of any house of the annual value of fifty pounds existing at the date of the confirmation of this Order, or of any garden or

pleasure ground occupied therewith, except with the consent in writing of the owner, lessee, and occupier of such house.

3. All costs, charges, and expenses of, and incidental to, the application for, obtaining and confirming this Order, shall be paid by the Burial Board in the manner provided by Section two hundred and thirty-four of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878.

4. The powers of compulsory purchase given by this Order shall not be Duration of exercised after the expiration of three years from the confirmation of this Order.

5. This Order may be cited and referred to for all purposes as the Tawnagh Shorttitle of 10 Burial Ground Provisional Order, 1892.

PROVISIONAL ORDER.

And whereas the Burial Board have deposited in the office of the Local Government Board in Dublin plans and a book of reference (herein-after called 35 the deposited plans and book of reference), showing and describing the said lands and premises.

It is ordered by the Local Government Board as follows:-

- 1. From and after the confirmation of this Order by Parliament, the Burial Board shall be empowered to put in force the powers of 5 the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement, with reference to the lands and premises shown and described in the deposited plans and book of reference, that is to say: All that part of the lands of Ballynakill immediately adjacent to the present burial ground of Ballynakill 10 containing one rood statute measure or thereabouts.
- 2. No part of the said additional burial ground shall be made within three hundred yards of any house of the annual value of fifty pounds existing at the date of the confirmation of this Order, or of any garden or pleasure ground occupied therewith, except with the consent in writing of the 15 owner, lessee, and occupier of such house.

Expenses of Order.

3. All costs, charges, and expenses of, and incidental to, the application for, obtaining and confirming this Order, shall be paid by the Burial Board in the manner provided by Section two hundred and thirty-four of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878.

4. The powers of compulsory purchase given by this Order shall not be exercised after the expiration of three years from the confirmation of this Order.
