

Bank Holidays Bill.

MEMORANDUM.

The object of this Bill is to provide that whenever Christmas Day falls on a Sunday not only the Monday but also the Tuesday following shall be a Bank Holiday.

TO

Make further provision for Bank Holidays in England and Ireland and to amend the Holidays Extension Act, 1875. A.D. 1909.

BE it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

- 5 **1.** Whenever the *twenty-sixth day of December* shall fall on a Monday the Tuesday immediately next following, that is to say, the *twenty-seventh day of December*, shall be a holiday under the Holidays Extension Act, 1875, and also under the Bank Holidays Act, 1871. When 26th December falls on a Monday the day following also to be a bank holiday.
- 10 **2.** This Act shall be read as one with the Holidays Extension Act, 1875. Construction.
- 3.** This Act may be cited as the Holidays Act, 1909. Short title.
