LORD LIEUTENANT-GENERAL AND GENERAL GOVERNOR OF IRELAND.

I have the honour of submitting to your Excellency my Report on the Statistics of Emigration from Ireland for the year 1912. Emigration
from Irish
Ports.

For the purposes of this Report an "Emigrant" is defined as "a person who leaves Ireland with the intention of *settling permanently elsewhere*," and the Enumerators have instructions to make a return of such persons departing *in each passenger ship* which sails from an Irish port.

During the year, monthly returns were published, giving the number of emigrants, and showing the comparative figures for the preceding years.

The summary portion of this Report consists of 5 detailed tables:—Table 1 shows for each county and province, the numbers, sexes, ages, and conjugal condition of the persons who emigrated from Ireland in the year 1912.—Table 2 shows the ages and occupations of the male and female emigrants who left Ireland in the year 1912.—Table 3 gives information regarding the occupations by certain age-periods of the emigrants who left Ireland for the United States of America in the year 1912.—Table 4 shows the destinations of emigrants (natives of Ireland) from each province and county during the year 1912, and the number of emigrants from each county to every 1,000 of the population, according to the Census of 1911. Table 5 gives the number of male and female emigrants (natives of Ireland) who left 21 Irish Ports, respectively, during each month of the year 1912.

During the year 1912 the total number of emigrants from Ireland was 29,799 (15,675 males and 14,124 females). Of the males, 15,325, and of the females, 14,019, were natives of Ireland, the total number, 29,344, being equivalent to a rate of 6.7 per 1,000 of the population estimated to the middle of the year 1912, and showing a decrease of 1,229 as compared with the year 1911.

The collection of Emigration Returns for Ireland commenced on the 1st May, 1851, and the reports based thereon show that the total number of emigrants—Number of

1851-1912. natives of Ireland—who left Irish ports from the above-mentioned date to the end of December, 1912, amounts, in the aggregate, to 4,247,360, the number of males being 2,207,637, and of females 2,039,723. The number of emigrants for each year.

from 1st May, 1851, to the 31st December, 1912, is given in Table I, also the estimated population and the emigration rate per 1,000 for each year of the included period.

The above tabular statement shows that the largest number of emigrants for any year of the period 1852–1912 was 190,322 in the year 1852, this number representing a rate of 30.0 per 1,000 of the population of Ireland estimated to the middle of the year; and that the lowest number was 23,295 (or 5.3 per 1,000 of the estimated population) in the year 1908. Between the figures for 1852 and 1908 the six highest numbers were—173,148 in 1853, affording a rate of 27.9 per 1,000; 140,555, or 23.1 per 1,000, in 1854; 117,229 in 1863, with a rate of 20.5 per 1,000; 114,169 in 1864, with a rate of 20.2 per 1,000 of the estimated population; 108,724 in 1883, the rate per 1,000 of the population being 21.6; and 101,497 in 1865, or 18.1 per 1,000 of the population; and the six lowest between the extremes referred to were 28,676 (equivalent to 6.5 per 1,000 of the population) in 1909; 29,344 (equivalent to 6.7 per 1,000 of the population) in 1912; 30,573 (equivalent to 7.0 per 1,000 of the population) in 1911; 30,676 (equivalent to 7.0 per 1,000 of the population) in 1905; 32,241 in 1898, the rate per 1,000 of the estimated population being 7.1; and 32,457 (or 7.4 per 1,000) in 1910.

For the year 1912 the number of emigrants is below the average for any of the decennial periods for which records are available. In the ten years 1902–1911, the average was 33,698; in the ten years, 1892–1901, the average number of emigrants was 41,352; in the ten years 1882–1891, the annual average was 75,191; in the ten years, 1872–1881, the average number was 63,111; in the ten-yearly period, 1862–1871, it was 85,678; and the average for the ten years, 1852–1861 was 107,565.

The number of emigrants from Ireland by provinces, in each of the years 1911 and 1912, according to sex, with the increase or decrease in the year 1912, is shown in Table II. When compared with 1911, it appears that there is for Leinster a decrease of 340, for Munster a decrease of 516, for Ulster a decrease of 180, and for Connaught of a decrease of 193 emigrants.

During the year 1912, of the 29,344 natives of Ireland who left the country, 3,855 were from Leinster, or 3.3 per 1,000 of the population of the province in 1911; 7,167, or 6.9 per 1,000, from Munster; 11,852, or 7.5 per 1,000 from Ulster; 6,470, or 10.6 per 1,000 from Connaught; the total number being equal to 6.7 per 1,000 of the population of Ireland estimated to the middle of 1912.

Table III. on page 6 shows the numbers and sexes of the emigrants from each county and province of Ireland from the 1st of May, 1851, to the 31st of December, 1912, and, for the purposes of comparison between the several counties and provinces in Ireland, the percentage of emigrants to the population† is also given.

Number of Emigrants from each County and Province.

It may be seen from this table that during the period mentioned above an aggregate total of 4,297,222 persons emigrated from Irish ports. Of these 4,247,360 were natives of Ireland, and 49,862 were persons belonging to other countries. The number of natives of Ireland (4,247,360) who emigrated during the period (1851–1912) is equivalent to 81.4 per cent. of the average population,† Munster contributing 1,474,089 persons, being equal to 109.9 per cent. of the average population of the province; Connaught, 714,705, or 89.7 per cent.; Ulster, 1,214,078, or 69.2 per cent.; and Leinster, 733,749, equivalent to 55.5 per cent. of its average population.† The county to which the emigrants belonged was not specified in the returns in 110,739 cases; this information, has, however, been obtained in every case since 1876, with the exception of 53 cases in 1880 and 71 in 1903.

It appears from Table IV., in which the ages of the emigrants in the year 1912 are shown in 9 periods, that 85.9 per cent. of the persons who left Ireland in 1912 were between the ages of fifteen and thirty-five years, the percentage over thirty-five years of age being 6.5, and that of persons under fifteen years 7.6. In 1911 the corresponding percentages for the three age-periods given above, were 85.7, 6.7, and 7.6, respectively, and in 1910 the respective percentages were 86.9, 6.2, and 6.9. The percentage of the emigrants in 1909, who were from fifteen to thirty-five years of age, was 86.3; in 1908 the percentage was 81.2; in 1907 it was 83.9; in 1906 it was 83.1; in 1905, it was 84.1; in 1904, it was 83.8; in 1903, it was 80.9; in 1902, 81.5; in 1901, 80.5; in 1900, 82.2; in 1899, 82.9; in 1898, 82.3; in 1897, 83.0; in 1896, 83.7; in 1895, 84.7; in 1894, 83.1; in 1893, 85.0; and in 1892, 83.2.

The numbers, ages, sexes, and conjugal condition of the emigrants from each county of Ireland are given, in Table 1., pages 10–11, together with corresponding information with respect to persons belonging to other countries, who embarked at Irish ports during the year 1912. The only quinquennial age-period in which the females greatly outnumbered the males is that between fifteen and twenty; at this age-period the number of females was 4,090, and of males 1,999. The quinquennial age-period, 20–25 years, furnished the largest number of both male and female emigrants (6,982 males and 5,554 females)—the emigrants at this age-period forming 42.1 per cent. of the entire number of those who emigrated during the year 1912.

During the year 1912 of the male emigrants, numbering 15,675, there were 1,481, or 9.5 per cent. described as married men or widowers; and of the 14,124 female emigrants, 1,587, or 11.2 per cent., were returned as married or widowed. Of the 12,536 persons between the ages of 20 and 25 years who emigrated, 278 only were married—91 males and 187 females.

In Table 4 on page 15 the destinations of the emigrants—natives of Ireland—from each county during the year 1912 are shown. This table shows that 27,477 (or 93.6 per cent. of the total) emigrated to the Colonies or to Foreign Countries, and 1,867 (or 6.4 per cent.) to Great Britain. The United States of America was the destination of 20,466 emigrants (or 69.7 per cent. of the total number of emigrants—natives of Ireland—in 1912) in comparison with an average of 21,388 (or 74.3 per cent.) for the four preceding years. Emigration to Canada shows an increase of 310 in 1912, as compared with 1911, the numbers being 5,788 in 1912, and 5,478 in 1911. The number of emigrants to South Africa in 1912 was 147, as against 113 in the year 1911. The emigrants to Australia numbered 842 in 1912, as against 765 in 1911, 613 in 1910, 782 in 1909, 607 in 1908, 365 in 1907, 343 in 1906, 285 in 1905, 336 in 1904, 380 in 1903, 496 in 1902, 595 in 1901, 834 in 1900, 1,005 in 1899, 837 in 1898, 676 in 1897, 545 in 1896, 629 in 1895, 457 in 1894, 511 in 1893, and 1,216 in 1892.

The emigrants to New Zealand numbered 189 in 1912, as against 166 in 1911. The 45 persons who went to "Other Countries" in the year 1912 include 15 returned as emigrating to France, 11 to South America, 6 to India, 5 to China, 2 to each of Italy, Belgium, and Jamaica, one to Holland, and one to Gibraltar.

Of the emigrants—natives of Ireland—to the United States in 1912, in number 20,466, there were 6,591 natives of Munster, 6,128 of Connaught, 5,165 of Ulster, and 2,582 of Leinster. Ulster contributed 377 and Leinster 248 of the 842 who left for Australia. Ulster furnished the largest contingent to Canada—4,700 out of a total of 5,788 emigrants.

During the year 1912, the number of natives of Ireland who emigrated with the intention of settling permanently in Great Britain, was 1,867. Of the total, 1,421 left for England and Wales, and 446 for Scotland, as against 1,765 and 623, the respective averages for emigrants to these countries for the four years preceding. Of the number who went to England and Wales during the year, 1,057 or 74.4 per cent. were natives of the province of Ulster, and of the 446 who went to Scotland no less than 355 or 79.6 per cent. were also from Ulster.

The destinations of the emigrants—natives of Ireland—in 1912, the Census populations in 1911 and the ratio of the emigrants to every 1,000 of the population for each county and province, are shown in Table 4 on page 15. From this table it appears that the highest provincial rate was 10.6 per 1,000 of the population for Connaught; Ulster came next with a rate of 7.5, and the rates for Munster and Leinster were, respectively, 6.9 and 3.3 per 1,000. In the counties the highest rates were as follows:—Mayo, 12.0; Leitrim, 11.9; Galway, 10.6; Cavan, 10.3; Kerry, 10.0; Longford, 9.7; Clare, 9.6; Sligo, 9.2; Armagh, 8.0 and Roscommon, 8.0.

The occupations and ages of the emigrants of each sex who left Ireland in 1912 are given in Table 2, on pages 12-13. From an examination of this table it will be seen that of the 14,569 males aged 15 years and upwards, 9,306, or 63.9 per cent., were returned as "labourers"; and of the 12,946 females at 15 years and upwards, 9,258, or 71.5 per cent., were returned as "servants."

The number of emigrants who embarked as steerage passengers to the United States was 18,357, and of these 5,762 had their passages paid for in America.

In the following statement a comparison is shown between the figures for 1912 and those for each of the 8 years, 1904-11 :—

Of the emigrants whose passages were paid for in America, and who numbered 5,762 in the year 1912, 383 left in March Quarter, 2,933 in June Quarter, 1,566 in September Quarter, and 880 in December Quarter.
