MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY:

We, the Board of Superintendence of the City of Dublin Hospitals, have the honour to submit to Your Excellency this our Fifty-ninth Annual Report under Statute 19 and 20 Vict., cap. 110, passed on the 29th July, 1856, entitled Dublin Hospitals Regulation Act.

During the year ending 31st March, 1917, we have inspected all

the Hospitals which receive grants from Parliament.

Viz.:—

1. Westmoreland Lock Hospital.

2. Steevens' Hospital.

3. Meath Hospital and County Dublin Infirmary.

4. Cork Street Fever Hospital.

5. The House of Industry Hospitals, viz.:-

(a) Hardwicke Fever Hospital.(b) Whitworth Medical Hospital.(c) Richmond Surgical Hospital.

6. Rotunda Lying-in Hospital.7. Coombe Lying-in Hospital.

8. The Royal Victoria Eye and Ear Hospital; and

 Royal Hospital for Incurables, which receives a portion of the Concordatum Fund.

On these occasions we carefully observed and inquired into the state and condition of each institution to ascertain that the wards were clean and well ventilated, that every provision was made for the treatment, comfort, and welfare of the patients, and that the several buildings were kept in good repair and in a sanitary condition. We made inquiries respecting the current expenses of each hospital and the system of purchasing, storing, cooking, and issuing supplies; we looked into the nursing arrangements, and into the means available in each hospital for the extinction of an outbreak

of fire, and for the escape of the inmates in the event of such an occurrence, and, in fact, into all such matters as might assist us in supervising these hospitals, and in reporting thereon in accordance with the provisions of the 18th section of the Act of 19 & 20 Vict.,

cap. 110.

In the Appendix are tables giving the following particulars for each hospital during the year:—Table No. 1 is a Classified Return of the Diseases of Patients. No. 2 shows the number of Patients treated; the mortality; the average daily number in hospital, and the present extent of accommodation for each class of patients. No. 3 shows the several sources of income. No. 4 the several chief heads of expenditure. No. 5 the average cost per bed for maintenance and for establishment and for both combined, but exclusive of buildings and furniture. No. 6 gives the prices of articles supplied per contract. No. 7 gives the attendances of each member of the Board of Governors at the several meetings.

A study of these tables, taken in conjunction with what we ourselves have observed, enables us to report that the hospitals under the superintendence of this Board fulfil in an economical and thorough way the objects for which they were instituted.

In submitting, as we are now about to do, a special report on each Hospital, we beg to point out that in one and all of these institutions there has been for very many years an energetic striving to keep abreast of the times, and that they have by now reached a high standard of efficiency, details of which, if fully given, would lead only to wearying repetition.

## RICHMOND, WHITWORTH, AND HARDWICKE HOSPITALS.

We found every department of this Hospital working admirably, and every corner of it clean and in good sanitary condition.

722 sick and wounded soldiers were treated in it during the year. Although a number of the staff are serving in the Army, we found work being carried on very much as usual, owing to the remaining staff taking on increased duties. Even the Extern Dispensaries have been carried on as in pre-war days; the number of cases attended to being 4,617.

For financial reasons very few additions or alterations, how-

ever much desired, could be effected.

Through the generosity of Mr. Bernard Robinson, executor of the will of the late Mr. Bernard Carew, of Trim, the sum of £100 was placed at the disposal of the Board for the purchase of a "Finsen" Lamp. This has proved a great acquisition to the Skin Diseases Department.

In the servants' sleeping quarters the old stone floors have been replaced by wooden flooring, and modern grates have been erected.

A circulating hot-water system of heating has been installed in the Hardwicke Fever Hospital with excellent results. It has been designed to work in with the plans prepared a few years ago for remodelling the whole building; the estimated cost of which, in pre-war days, was £12,000, but has not yet been carried out owing to lack of funds.

#### ROTUNDA HOSPITAL

This Institution goes on from day to day like a well-regulated clock. We went fully over it, and have nothing but praise for The Master is in France at the front. Owing to what we saw. the increased prices of provisions, the cost of feeding the staff works out as 34 or 35 per cent. over pre-war figures. As there is a large out-patient staff, this accounts for the apparently large cost per bed, as that cost is got by dividing the number of beds into the total expenditure.

Memorandum as to proportion of Nurse's Fees received by the Hospital.

Each Pupil Midwife pays a fee of £26 5s. for her course of instruction and training.

£16 5s. of this goes direct to the Hospital's funds for the pupil's

maintenance.

The balance, £10, is called the Instruction Fee. Three-fourths of this goes to the Hospital, and the remaining one-fourth is paid to the Master for the time being.

The Gynæcological Probationers each pay a fee of £10, which

is received by the Hospital.

#### STEEVENS' HOSPITAL.

In this Institution the architecture takes one back to the century before the last, but the work done is according to the latest advances The favourable impressions of previous years were renewed by all we saw during our very thorough inspection. Ever since the Westmoreland Lock Hospital was closed to males suffering from venereal disease, a special ward has been maintained here for such patients. The Governors have this year still further increased the accommodation. This seems to us a wise step, in view of the recent statistics, showing the dire and far-reaching menace to public health caused by the great prevalence of syphilis. In this respect, as well as in the open-air ward referred to in last year's report, Steevens' has set a good example to the other Dublin Hospitals.

#### THE MEATH HOSPITAL.

This Institution, with a Staff diminished by the call of the war, ... does its work as usual. After a very critical inspection we have nothing but good to say of it. Details would be out of place, as

they stand forth in previous reports.

At the commencement of the year there were 21 wounded soldiers in Hospital, 209 were admitted during the year. Of these, 217 were discharged, 1 died, and 12 remained at the close. 8,665 days were spent by them in Hospital, the average daily number of beds occupied being 23.74.

The Matron reports that 26 fully trained nurses have been appointed direct from the Hospital to Queen Alexandra's Imperial Military Nursing Service Reserve, and that 115 cadets of the Voluntary Aid Department (V.A.D.) have received training in practical nursing of from one to three months each.

## THE HOUSE OF RECOVERY AND FEVER HOSPITAL, CORK STREET.

There is nothing to report specially about this Institution. It continues to do its useful work with remarkable efficiency and economy.

223 soldiers, 29 N.C.Os., and 14 officers were treated during the

year.

Owing to present cost of materials, no improvements were carried out, and only the necessary repairs done.

The motor ambulance has been so successful that the Committee

have under consideration the advisability of buying another.

The Committee report that they have had four acres of the land attached to Beneavin Convalescent Home put under tillage.

#### ROYAL VICTORIA EYE AND EAR HOSPITAL.

Our inspection showed us this charitable Institution in full work at a high standard of active beneficence. What it does towards lessening the dead weight of human physical inefficiency is plain to see, for its work is on the surface. We were glad to find that the Treasury allows it sixpence a day for unoccupied beds in the Military Wards. It is an altogether insufficient sum, but it is something to see even such recognition of a principle for which we strove in vain at the outset of the war.

"DEAR SIR,

"In reply to your letter, dated 1st inst., rc average cost per bed for maintenance, I beg to state that I have gone into the matter carefully, and am of opinion that the decrease in cost is due to two things—

"1st. We have tried to keep within the Davenport Ration Scale. This we find caused a decrease in consumption of meat, &c. No butter has been used, and where a matter of 1 cwt. of sugar was used a stone has to suffice now. Our contracts have not increased

during the period.

"2nd. We have obtained the services of an exceptional cook, who has, I am sure, saved us many pounds, utilising things that before were counted of no value. A large quantity of eggs and vegetables have been received from the British Red Cross Society.

#### THE COOMBE LYING-IN HOSPITAL.

We came away thoroughly satisfied with the state of this Hospital. Its cleanliness, its sanitation under all heads, and the way in which it was being worked, met with our full approval. We beg to repeat all that we said last year.

#### THE WESTMORELAND LOCK HOSPITAL.

Every department of this Hospital appears to work well, and is kept in admirable order for an old Institution. We have nothing but praise for the cleanliness and ventilation of the wards, lavatories, the state of the bedding and washing, the food, the cooking, and the discipline and contentment of the inmates. Patients claiming admission are undoubtedly well treated and well cared for.

But in passing from these particulars we are asked to what extent such Institutions contribute to the advantage and protection of the community at large as well as towards answering the terrible indictment which syphilis makes against those responsible for the treatment and permanent cure of the disease.

In reply to these important points, we wish to remark here that in the light of modern science and of our extended knowledge regarding the causation and treatment of venereal diseases, we think that further reforms are urgently necessary, so that greater powers should be conferred on the Governors of this Institution to enable them to retain female patients admitted to their wards for such time until the Medical Officers could, with a degree of certainty, feel assured that these patients have been successfully and completely cured in the Hospital before they are allowed to obtain their discharge. For it is well known, patients leaving Hospital prematurely become again a menace and centre of infection among our civil and military male population, perhaps in a worse form—lulled by a false security.

We feel bound to put forward our views on this important question very strongly owing to the ignorance and false delicacy prevailing on such matters, and the heavy toll levied by venereal diseases on the inhabitants of the United Kingdom—a toll which it is most dangerous to overlook, especially just now, when the enormous wastage of our man-power in this present European War

is threatening the virility of nations.

#### ROYAL HOSPITAL FOR INCURABLES.

Coming away from this Hospital our Chairman remarked: "If after the war we can make our military incurables as happy and contented as are these sufferers, we shall indeed do well." Our inspection was full and thorough, and we report as usual that the establishment is in perfect working order, and, further, that the contented spirit of the place is fully maintained.

In making these Reports to Your Excellency, it is incumbent

on us to draw attention to the fact that the good work being done by our Dublin Hospitals, not only for the civil population but also for the wounded of the war, is, owing to the increased cost of provisions, bringing them deeply into debt. The Governors of the various Institutions do not think it advisable at such a time to close up beds, neither is it a time to call on the public for increased subscriptions; their debit balance, therefore, goes on increasing. We have been asked by most of the Hospitals to press this view of the situation on the notice of the authorities.
