Head and other Constables stationed at Belfast are granted 1 s. per week in addition to their pay, with a view to meet the extra expense for lodging and living, to which the men serving in that town are exposed, as compared with the remainder of the force, 29 & 30 Vict. c. 103, sect. 10.

388. Gratuities and pensions will be calculated in accordance with the provisions of 29 & 30 Vict. c. 103.

On Duty in Plain Clothes.

391. Rates of extra pay to Head and other Constables for each night necessarily absent from home on special duty in plain clothes, subject to the Inspector General's approval of the account, which is to be submitted on the prescribed form:

392. But when Head or other Constables, absent from their Station in plain clothes, find it necessary to remain at a place for more than a week, they are not allowed to charge, beyond that period, more than one-half of the sums above stated.

General Rules.

No greater sum will be allowed, or is to be charged, for car, coach, packet, boat, or railway fares than that actually incurred; nor will any expense whatever for information, &c., be allowed-

The fare by coach is to be for an outside place; by steamboat, for the second cabin; by railways in Ireland, for the third class; by railways in England, for the second class.

394. Special Rates of Allowance at Depôt:

Drill.—An allowance of 5 l. per annum each is granted to six Drill Instructors at the Depôt, one of whom is to be the Rough-riding Constable, which allowance is only to be drawn during the actual performance of the duties, and is to be forfeited when absent on leave or on the sick report. The Commandant is therefore to certify on the account, that the individuals for whom the allowance is charged have duly performed the duties for the period stated. Drill Constables may or may not, as the Inspector General may direct, be placed on the extra rate of 40 l. per annum.

Assistant Drills.—Sub Constables so employed for a period of twelve months to the satisfaction of the Adjutant and Commandant, will be promoted to the temporary rank of Acting Constable; but should they cease to discharge the duties in question, they revert to their proper rank.

Rough

Rough Riders .- Constable, see Drills.

Sub-Constable, 321.7 s. per annum, during the actual performance of the duties, certified by the Commandant as above.

Repairs of Saddlery .- One shilling per month for each saddle in use at the Depôt.

395. Allowances to Officers acting in the absence of others:

I.—To an Officer acting in the absence of the Commandant of the Depôt, after the first 30 days, five shillings per diem: such allowance to be paid by the Commandant, if absent on leave; but if incapable from sickness of performing the functions of his office, or if absent on duty, the amount to be charged under the proper head, on the authority of the Inspector General, in the public accounts.

II.—To an Officer acting in the absence of a County Inspector or of the Paymaster of the Depôt, after the first 30 days, four shillings per diem; to be paid or charged as in the preceding case. If, however, the Officer acting for a County Inspector draws the allowance for an office and for stationery, he is only entitled to the difference between these allowances and 4s.: viz., two shillings and sevenpence per diem. County Inspector's Clerk and official books to be sent at his expense to the station of the Officer so acting, if absent for his own convenience; if absent on duty, or from sickness, the expense to be charged to the public.

III.—When a Head Constable has the charge of a district in the absence of the Sub-Inspector, or during a vacancy, he will be permitted the use of the public horse attached to the district; and such horse is to be attended, as usual, by the mounted orderly in whose care it is. The Head Constable is not entitled to the Officer's forage allowance, but he is to receive the stationery allowance of a Sub-Inspector whilst in charge of a district.

Marching Money.

396. When granted.—This allowance will be granted in the following cases, only, when the distance shall exceed 12 miles, viz.:

1st. When on a march from one county to another.

2ndly. When transferred from one Station to another, whether within their own counties or otherwise, except as in section 397.

3rdly. When proceeding to and returning from Assizes, Quarter Sessions, and Elections.

4thly. When proceeding to and returning from the County Inspector's office, for examination for promotion.

397. When not granted.—When men are conveyed at the public expense, they will not be entitled to marching allowance; nor when they are removed at their own request, or on promotion, or for misconduct. There may, however, be special cases in which men are promoted and transferred for the good of the service; in such cases special authority for granting marching allowance may be given.

398. When the men receive marching allowance, as above, they are not to receive extra pay for the period on march; they can only receive the one or the other for the same day.

399. Authority for Marching Money.—It is unnecessary to submit for the Inspector General's approval, claims for marching money to which men may be duly entitled, in such cases as recruits joining or proceeding from the Depôt (who may be paid under the authority of the Commandant), or men proceeding from one county to another (who may be paid such allowance under the authority of the County Inspector); but in other cases, and especially where claims for extra pay or travelling allowance are involved, the authority of the Inspector General is indispensable to the charge.

400. Ten Hours' Absence from Home.—When Sub-Inspectors are employed at fairs, races, in the protection of sheriffs or of coroners, in the escort of prisoners, or on any other duty of a like nature (except on inspection, patrol, warrant, dispatch, or Petty Sessions duty), which shall necessarily detain them from their Stations for a period of not less than 10 consecutive hours, they shall be allowed one-half the amount of extra pay that they are entitled to when absent the whole night. Head Constables employed under similar circumstances, and with the like exceptions, will be entitled to 9 d., and other constables to 6 d.; provided that, in the event of any member of the force being employed on duty during 10 hours of any day, and through the night of that day, extra pay for the night only shall be allowed. Should the privilege granted by this section be in the least degree abused, it will be withdrawn.

423. County Store.—The allowance for an Assistant Storekeeper in each county is 10 l. per annum, including rent and other expenses of the store.

424. When the store is kept in a constabulary barrack (whether held rent-free or not), the sum of 50 s. is to be re-credited to the public, and the remaining sum of 7 L 10 s. per annum to be paid to the Assistant Storekeeper.

Stationery

Stationery Allowance.—Sixpence per month to the Head or other Constable in charge of each Station.

Medical Allowance.- One shilling per month for each Officer, Head and other Constable.

Compensation for Clothing .- When not supplied, 2 s. 7 d. per month per man.

Lodging Allowance.—When there is no barrack accommodation, not exceeding 6 s. per month per man.
