THE REPORT

OF THE

PRESIDENT OF QUEEN'S COLLEGE, CORK,

FOR

THE ACADEMIC SESSION 1888-89.

TO THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY-

I have the honour of submitting to Your Majesty the following Report on Queen's College, Cork, for the Academic Session 1888-89, in compliance with a provision of the Act of Parliament founding the Queen's Colleges in Ireland (8 and 9 Vic., c. 6, s. 20), and in accordance with the College Statutes.

At the Entrance Examination in October and the supplementary examination, 26 candidates presented themselves, of these 17 passed, and 9 were rejected; 33 students were admitted on the matriculation examination of the Royal University, and 19 from other Universities and Colleges, making in all 69 new matriculated students; 7 also entered as non-matriculated students, so that the total number of new students was 76. The total number of students on the books of the College for the session was 229, of whom 218 were matriculated, and 11 non-matriculated.

In the Appendix (A., pp. 9 to 13) I have given the usual detailed statistical information about the College, to which I refer for all further numerical details.

I regret to announce the death in the early part of the Session of Dr. O'Connor, who since the opening of the College occupied the chair of Medicine with honour to himself and advantage to the students. Dr. E. R. Townsend, who for the two previous sessions acted as occasional locum tenens for Professor O'Connor, undertook the same duty for the Session 1888-89, and on the

death of Dr. O'Connor was selected by the Council to continue the lectures, and was then appointed by Your Majesty as Dr. O'Connor's successor. This appointment renews the connection between the College and the South Infirmary which formerly subsisted, and which will contribute to the development of clinical instruction in our School of Medicine.

DISCIPLINE.

Discipline has been very well maintained during the Session, there having been no case requiring the intervention of the Council.

LIBRARY, MUSEUMS, LABORATORIES.

Library.—The arrears of binding, by the accumulation of long sets of journals, which could not be provided for out of the small sum set apart for this purpose in the annual vote, were cleared off by the allocation of a sum of money from the unappropriated balance, so that the Library has in that respect been put in a very fair condition. The difficulty, however, of providing for the increase in the number of volumes still remains, and must be met sooner or later by the erection of a new Library.

MUSEUMS.

Natural History Museum.—The Board of Works have provided in this year's estimates for the completion of the cases in the Natural History Museum, for which there were not hitherto sufficient funds.

Pathological Museum.—Many additions have been made to the Pathological Museum, which under the care of Dr. Cotter, is rapidly progressing.

Laboratories.—Chemical Laboratory.—One of the Secretaries of the Royal University of Ireland, having been deputed to report to the Vice-Chancellor on Medical Institutions in Cork, has called attention to the utter inadequacy of the present Chemical Laboratory to the requirements of the Professor, who has been compelled to divide his class, thereby causing considerable inconvenience to himself and to his Students. This bears out what I have stated in previous reports.

Physical and Engineering Workshops.—The work projected in this department in my last report has been in great measure carried out.

Biological and Physiological Laboratories.—These laboratories, although constructed at a comparatively recent date, were intended for far smaller classes than now attend them. As practical work in these subjects is obligatory in the curriculum of the Royal University, the Professors are put to great inconvenience by the limited room. I have this year asked to have provision made for increased accommodation in both laboratories, but I regret to say that nothing has been done in the matter.

BOTANIC GARDEN AND PLANT HOUSE.

The Botanic Garden and Plant House are in excellent condition. I have on several occasions called attention to four great wants in the Plant House, viz., the construction of a succulent compartment, the heating of the house for oranges, acacias, and similar plants; the building of a gallery in the Palm House, and the erection of a small Propagating House. I regret that only one of these, the building of the gallery, has been provided for this year.

THE MEDICAL SCHOOL.

I trust that some steps will be taken this year to enlarge the Teaching Staff of the Medical School in accordance with the present requirements of medical education.
