OF THE

PRESIDENT OF QUEEN'S COLLEGE, CORK,

FOR

THE ACADEMIC SESSION 1890-91.

TO THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY:

I have the honour to submit to Your Majesty the following Report on Queen's College, Cork, for the Session 1890-91.

At the Entrance Examination in October, and at the Supplementary Examination, 17 candidates presented themselves, of whom 9 passed, and 8 were rejected; 64 students were admitted on the Matriculation Examination of the Royal University, and 11 from other Universities and Colleges, making in all 84 new matriculated students; 10 were entered as non-matriculated students, so that the total number of new students amounted to 94. The number of students on the books of the College for the Session was 245, of whom 234 were matriculated, and 11 non-matriculated.

The Council in January last instituted Lectureships in certain subjects in which a want of special teaching has long been felt. Candidates highly qualified to undertake the duties having come forward, the following appointments were made:—

Pathology, . Jeremiah Cotter, M.D., M.CH.
Ophthalmology and Otology, Arthur W. Sandford, M.D., M.CH.
Hygiene, . Denis D. Donovan, L.R.C.P. & S. Ed.
Architecture, . Arthur Hill, B.E., M.R., S.B.A.

The Lecturers will, it is expected, be able to begin work during the coming session. The vacant Lectureship in Psychological Medicine has been filled by the appointment of Oscar Woods, M.D. Dub., L.R.C.S.I., and Resident Superintendent of the Eglinton Asylum, Cork.

The additions to our equatorial telescope required to enable the College to take part in the work of photographing the heavens have been completed and the instrument placed in position. The task was entrusted to Sir Howard Grubb, and executed with his usual skill and success. The expenses have been defrayed by the administrators of the late W. H. Crawford, of Lakelands, to whose munificence the existence of the observatory itself and of its instruments is due. Professor England has hitherto at much sacrifice of time and attention taken charge of its working, but the increased labour now required will make the appointment of an assistant necessary. As a contribution towards a fund for his payment Mr. Crawford's administrators have consented to give £400.

The want of room for a constantly increasing store of books becomes more pressing every year. Thousands of volumes have been stowed away in the Entrance Tower. The Examination Hall has been lined with shelves now fully stocked. The wallspace in the Geological Lecture-room has been utilised. Librarian's private room has been annexed. A new Library, therefore, appears to be urgently needed. Plans for such a building, including students' reading-room, waiting-room, &c., were made some years ago, but their adoption was prevented by various obstacles of a temporary nature. Another urgent want is that of a new Chemical Laboratory. In the present one there is accommodation for only thirty students. Of late years there has been an average attendance of nearly twice that number. Hence, the Professor has been obliged to divide his class into two sets at a cost of double labour, and of complicated arrangements to avoid interference with other lectures. A new Laboratory could be provided in the building containing the new Library.
