PRESIDENT OF QUEEN'S COLLEGE, CORK,

FOR

THE SESSION 1891-92.

TO THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY:

I have the honour to submit to Your Majesty the following Report of the condition of Queen's College, Cork, for the Session 1891-92.

The number of students on the books of the College for the Session was 255, of whom 251 were matriculated, and 4 non-matriculated. The number of new students was 87, of whom 15 passed an entrance examination, 3 entered without matriculating, 52 were admitted from the Royal University of Ireland, and 17 from other Universities and Colleges.

Maxwell Simpson, LL.D., M.D., D.Sc., F.R.S., resigned in the autumn of last year the chair of Chemistry, the duties of which he had discharged for nineteen years with great efficiency and zeal. As his successor, Your Majesty was pleased to appoint Augustus E. Dixon, M.D., F.C.S., whose career as a student and Lecturer on Chemistry in Trinity College, Dublin, and as Professor of Chemistry in Queen's College, Galway, gave ample evidence of his learning and his ability as a teacher.

The administrator of the late W. H. Crawford, of Lakelands, having, in accordance with the wish of this munificent benefactor of the College, paid over a sum of £400 to enable the Observatory to be used for Stellar Photography, Mr. James Porter, B.E., a graduate of the College, who had acquired experience as an assistant in the Astronomical Physics Laboratory of the Science and Art Department, South Kensington, was appointed to carry out this work under the direction of Professor England.

Among the pressing wants of the College, that of a new Chemical Laboratory stands foremost. The Professor reports that not half the requisite number of working benches was available for the students who attended lectures in the practical branch of his subject. The provisions for ventilation and for storage of apparatus are also defective. The rooms occupied by this department are required for a Physical Laboratory and for an Engineering and Technical Museum. The need of the former is shown by the fact that the Professor of Natural Philosophy is obliged by the smallness of his lecture room to divide his class in Practical Physics into several sections. An excellent site for building may be had in the Materia Medica garden. Chemical Laboratory, fully provided with the most recent appliances and apparatus, is approaching completion in Queen's College, Belfast. It may therefore be hoped that a similar boon, so often applied for, will be no longer withheld from Queen's College. Cork.
