PRESIDENT OF QUEEN'S COLLEGE, BELFAST,

FOR THE

SESSION 1894-95.

TO THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY,

I have the honour to present to Your Majesty my annual Report on the condition and progress of Queen's College, Belfast, during the academic year 1894–95.

It has been usual to give an account in the first place of the

NUMBERS

of students in attendance. I beg therefore to report that in the past Session 117 entered the College for the first time, as compared with 112 in the previous year, and 97 the year before. The total numbers enrolled in the various faculties were—in the Faculty of Arts, 145: in the Faculty of Medicine, 212: in the Faculty of Law, 26: and in the School of Engineering, 13. Ten students attended in more than one Faculty. The number of ladies who attended lectures was 15, as compared with 13 last year. All our classes are now open to ladies, and I have great pleasure in being able to testify that their admission to College has been attended by none but the most excellent results. No doubt many more of them would attend were it not for the fact that, in the opinion of the Law Officers of the Crown in Ireland, our scholarships and prizes are not open to them. From this disability I sincerely hope they will soon be relieved.

It is interesting to note the localities from which the students came. Ulster, as might be expected, supplied the great majority, 336 of them belonging to this province: 11 came from Leinster: 6 from Connaught and 7 from Munster; while 12 were Englishmen, 5 Scotchmen, 2 came from Spain, 1 from India, 2 from Australia, 1 from Japan, 2 from the United States of America, and 1 from Canada. As regards age, 230 were over 21 and 156 younger. I am happy to report that the discipline was so uniformly good that during the entire year no student was charged before the Council with any offence.

LOSSES.

While speaking of the students, I cannot but refer with feelings of sincere sorrow to the deaths of three of our alumni which occurred during the year, viz .- Thomas Charles Grimshaw, B.A., who after obtaining high honours in the earlier years of his course had just entered for the Dunville Studentship last autumn. with every prospect of success, when his last illness unexpectedly seized him : Henry Tate, B.A., whose devotion to chemical research led to his obtaining a little time ago the important appointment of Assistant Government Analyst in Trinidad, on the duties of which he had entered with good promise of high service to the interests of that colony, and of honour and advancement to himself, when death laid him low; and Hugh Turretin Heron, B.A., M.B., whose name stands in the College Calendar as the holder of several high scholarships, and who had entered upon what all hoped would be a brilliant and useful career in the medical profession, when the end came. The deaths of all three were heard of in College with genuine grief.

To one other death which occurred during the year I must also allude, that of the venerable Rev. James M'Cosh, D.D., LL.D., formerly Professor of Logic and Metaphysics in this College, and latterly President of Princeton College, New Jersey. Although twenty-seven years have passed since he resigned his chair here, his memory is still green not only among us but among the many men who passed through his classes in the seventeen years during which he was a Professor in Belfast, and who still, in their various and widely separated walks of life, feel how much they owe to the sound and vigorous teaching, the keen intellectual stimulus, and the fatherly interest which they experienced at his hands.

CHANGES IN THE STAFF.

During the year now ended we have, I regret to say, lost the valuable services of Mr. John Wylie, who was Bursar for twentytwo years, having succeeded his uncle, the late Mr. Alexander Dickey, in 1872. The College never had a more faithful or more efficient officer in its service than Mr. Wylie, and universal sorrow was felt when failing health obliged him last autumn to retire. This regret was somewhat mitigated by the fact that his brother, Mr. William Wylie, was appointed by Your Majesty Bursar in his stead. This selection was received in the College with much satisfaction, and bids fair to prove of great advantage to the important department of which the Bursar has charge.

One other change in our Staff occurred during the year. Dr. W. H. Barrett having resigned the Lectureship in Pathology (which Dr. William Russell took up in his place for the summer session of last year, as mentioned in my last Report), the Council, after careful inquiry, and with the sanction of His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, appointed Dr. J. Lorrain Smith Lecturer in his place. Dr. Smith holds the Degrees of M.A. (with First Class Honours) and M.D. (with a Gold Medal) of the University of Edinburgh, and ever since his graduation has been devoting himself solely to research and teaching in Pathology at Oxford, Cambridge, Strassburg, and Copenhagen. His appointment is calculated not only materially to strengthen our Medical School, but to prove of great service to Belfast, where it is for many reasons important to have resident one highly skilled as he is in the methods and results of modern Pathology. On this subject I may here quote a few sentences from an address which I delivered on 1st May last when introducing Dr. Lorrain Smith to his classes :—

" Every year sees Pathology assuming by general consent a larger and larger place not only in medical science, but, at least as regards Bacteriology, one of its most important branches, in society at large. I am sorry to say that the facilities for teaching it here have hitherto not been at all commensurate with its importance. We do not yet possess a full professorship of Pathology; we have only a lectureship in the This from one point of view is not surprising, because it has only subject. been in recent years that this science has come to bulk so largely before the public mind. Making allowance, however, for this fact, it must be admitted that Belfast is far behind other places similarly circumstanced. Let me mention only three illustrations out of many of what has been done elsewhere. Take Cambridge. There Mr. John Lucas Walker has founded a studentship in the subject, which bears his name, and possesses an income of £400 per annum. In Aberdeen, again, the late Sir Erasmus Smith founded a professorship of Pathology, which has, I believe, yielded excellent results. But the third case which I shall mention is, perhaps, to us the most apposite of all--that of Liverpool, where a well-known and extensive shipowner, Mr. George Holt, has recently given to University College £3,000 for the equipment of a physiological laboratory, and £3,000 more for a pathological laboratory, and has founded two chairs, called by his name the Holt Professorships of Physiology and Pathology, each provided with an endowment of £350 per annum. When one considers what is thus being done elsewhere, and considers in particular the vast and growing importance of Bacteriology, which deals with those micro-organisms which we now know play a part of such enormous importance not only in the case of many diseases, but in almost every function of our daily lives-when one considers the vast importance, not only in the interests of medical science, but of the public health, of having this study adequately prosecuted and practised, one cannot help fervently wishing that some public spirited gentleman would arise among us to do for Belfast and the North of Ireland in the matter of Pathology what Mr. R. G. Dunville and the Sorella trustees did for Physiology when they founded a year or two ago the Dunville Professorship in that subject. I should count myself to have rendered an enormous service, not only to the College, but to the health and well-being of the entire community, if any words of mine were the means of leading to a consummation so devoutly to be wished."

I proceed now to speak of the

HONOURS AND SUCCESSES

won by students of this College during the year. Our College Scholarships, Exhibitions, and Studentships have continued to afford very valuable incentives to learning. I am also happy to say that, as in the past, so in the session now ended, those of our students, who have presented themselves at the various public Examinations have acquitted themselves in such a way as to show that there is no deterioration either in their quality or in the character of the teaching which they receive here.

Most of our students go for their degrees to

THE ROYAL UNIVERSITY

of Ireland, and the record of those who appeared at its various Examinations during 1894-95 is a highly honourable one. Commencing with the Summer Examinations of 1894, I find that on this occasion they carried off a total of 23 First Classes and 22 Second Classes in the several faculties of Arts, Law, Medicine, and Engineering, together with 15 Exhibitions varying in value from £15 to £36.

At the Autumn Examinations they gained a still more signal series of triumphs. For the first time certain Junior Fellowships were then offered for competition by the Senate. These are not only splendid prizes from a pecuniary point of view, being of the value of £200 per annum each and tenable for four years, but in dignity and importance they are the highest distinctions of the kind conferred by the University. Two were awarded in October last, and both were conferred on men from this College, Mr. Morton gaining the Fellowship in Mathematics and Mr. Woodburn that in Mental Science. At these Autumn Examinations Belfast men gained some other very high honours, including the Studentship in Experimental Science and many Exhibitions and Prizes.

Finally, at the Spring Medical Examinations of this year it is worthy of note that all the candidates at the Degrees Examination who were placed by the Examiners in the upper pass division were Belfast men, and all the honours conferred were won by Belfast men. Throughout the academic year, therefore, the students of this College have gained at the Royal University a series of honours of which any students and any College might be proud. But this, happily, is nothing new.

they have also taken some very high places during the year. Thus at Cambridge Mr. W. A. Houston was bracketed first in the Mathematical Examinations of St. John's College in December last, and in June of this year came out first in the same subject at the College Examinations, Mr. G. T. Locke being placed second of his year, and Mr. A. A. Robb being bracketed sixth in the First Class. Mr. James Rice was elected to an Entrance Exhibition in St. John's, taking second place among all the candidates. Mr. G. T. Locke was also elected to a Foundation Scholarship at St. John's in June last. Mr. R. K. M'Elderry was in the same month placed in the First Class of the Classical Tripos, Part II., with a star prefixed to his name for distinguished answering in the History section, and Mr. J. G. Leathem was at the same time placed in the First Division of the First Class in the Mathematical Tripos, Part II.

Our School of Law has also added to its laurels during the year. At the King's Inns Honours Examinations in October last Mr. F. J. Robb gained third place and a prize of £21. At the King's Inns "Continuous Course" Examination held in May, 1895, Mr. R. R. M'Cutcheon took the first place and the Victoria Prize of £21 in the Junior Class, and Mr. J. M. Whitaker the third place with the prize of £10. At the Solicitors' Examination Mr. W. A. Fitzhenry was bracketed first for the Findlater Scholarship, and Mr. Thomas Toye was awarded the silver medal. These successes show that our Law School continues to hold the high position to which I have repeatedly referred in my annual Reports.

The various

BUILDINGS

and the College Botanic Garden have been maintained in good order during the year. A considerable amount of damage was caused by the terrible storm of 21st December last, but this has been repaired. Various important improvements have been introduced in several departments, as, for instance, in the Anatomical Rooms, which are now heated by a hot-water apparatus, instead of the open fireplaces which were previously in use. The lighting of these rooms, and of the cloisters and other parts of the College, has also been materially improved.

It is with great satisfaction that I report that the erection of a block of buildings for the accommodation of the departments of Physiology and Pathology, for which the Treasury last summer made a grant, has been commenced. It will, it is hoped, be ready for occupation next spring, and then these most important departments will be provided with a suite of lecture rooms, laboratories, practical class rooms, and lecture rooms, such as they have never before enjoyed, and which must conduce greatly to the efficiency of the work and the advancement of those two branches of science.

The second annual course of popular

LECTURES ON HEALTH

was delivered during the winter, in accordance with the Deed of Foundation of the Dunville Chair of Physiology, by Professor Thompson. They were attended by crowded audiences, and I cannot doubt that the information which they diffused throughout the community on the important questions with which they dealt will prove of much advantage to the health of the people of Belfast.

During the year 800 volumes were added to

THE LIBRARY,

most of them by purchase, but a considerable number by presentation. A list of the kind donations made to it will be found in the Appendix. The Library now contains nearly 53,000 volumes. Steady progress continues to be made with the new catalogue, to the preparation of which I referred in my last Report. A considerable number of the sheets have been printed off under the supervision of Dr. Meissner, the Librarian, and there is every prospect of our possessing, at no distant date, a catalogue worthy of the College, which will render access to the treasures of the Library much more easy and profitable than it has hitherto been.

PORTRAIT OF JAMES MACADAM, ESQ.

I am happy to report that an admirable portrait of the late James MacAdam, Esq., the first Librarian of the College, and one of the best known of our local scientific men of the past generation, has been presented to us by his cousin, Miss MacAdam, and will be hung either in the Library or the Examination Hall. This is a most acceptable addition to our collection of portraits, which I would fain see still further increased by the accession of paintings of other notable men whom the College has had the good fortune to number upon its staff, but of whom it possesses no memorial.

THE MUSEUMS.

A considerable number of valuable specimens have been purchased for our Natural History Museum during the year, and the re-arrangement and cataloguing of the Medical Museum has progressed under the supervision of Professor Symington, its Curator.

REPORTS OF THE DEANS OF RESIDENCES.

It is with deep regret that I report to Your Majesty the death during the year of two of the Deans of Residences of the College, the Rev. Oliver M'Cutcheon, D.D., LL.D., and the Rev. T. H. M. Scott, M.A. Both took a deep interest in the performance of the duties of their responsible office, so that their demise involves a serious loss to the College as well as to the general community. From the other two Deans I have received the following reports, which speak for themselves :—

"DEAR MR. PRESIDENT,—I have much pleasure in being enabled to present again a favourable report of the Students of Queen's College, Belfast (Church of Ireland), for the past Session. In January last a very large number of the students attended a special service in St. Andrew's; and I hope to have this repeated at the beginning of next Session with the approval and aid of our Bishop.

THE STUDENTS' SOCIETIES.

The Societies founded and maintained by the students for their own improvement had useful and prosperous sessions last winter —the Literary and Scientific Society under the presidency of Mr. W. B. Morton, M.A., Jun. F.R.U.I., and the Medical Students' Association under that of Dr. W. D. Donnan. A pleasant feature in the proceedings of the former was supplied through the kind visits of two old students, Sir David Barbour, K.C.S.I., and the Rev. John M'Dermott, M.A., who returned to renew their acquaintance with the scenes of their youthful academic struggles, and favoured the Society with papers which were received with the utmost pleasure.

THE STUDENTS' UNION.

In former Reports I have referred with gratification to the movement for the establishment of a Students' Union which was initiated some three years since. It is with no small pleasure that I am now able to report that arrangements for the erection of the building have been almost completed, and that before the close of the present summer I expect good progress to be made with it. With the sanction of the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury, the Commissioners of Public Works in Ireland have authorised their Surveyor for the Northern District, Mr. Robert Cochrane, F.R.I.B.A., to act as architect of the structure, and have also undertaken its external maintenance when erected. Mr. Cochrane, who is an *alumnus* of the College, has undertaken his task *con amore*, and has designed a building which has met with the entire approval of the Committee, and will, I expect, not only admirably serve the purposes for which it is intended, but will form a worthy and notable addition to the College property. We hope that it will be ready for opening next spring.

UNIVERSITY EXTENSION IN BELFAST.

Although our local scheme for the extension of University teaching is not officially connected with the College, yet, as it is most intimately associated with it, nearly all the lecturers on the staff being Queen's College men, and its work proceeding as far as possible upon University lines, and much of it being carried on within the College, I may here refer briefly to its proceedings during the year now ended. Unquestionably last session was one of the most prosperous and vigorous that it has ever had. opened in September with a public meeting, at which it had the presence and advocacy of the Lord Mayor of Belfast (Mr. William M'Cammond, J.P.), the Countess of Shaftesbury, and others, and at which a characteristically brilliant and sympathetic address was delivered by the Marquess of Dufferin and Ava, which gave the work of the Society an immense stimulus. Immediately thereafter the lecturers set to work, and from that time till Easter the classes were in full operation. The subjects taken up were-Chemistry (in two classes, one of which was intended specially for working men), with Professor Letts as lecturer; English Literature, four classes of which were taught, the lecturer being Rev. E. I. Fripp; Political Economy, with Professor Graham as lecturer; and Applied Mechanics, with Professor FitzGerald as lecturer, this last being also specially intended for working men, and both it and the second course on Chemistry being under the joint direction of the Society for the Extension of University Teaching and the local Gilchrist Lectures Committee. There was a good attendance at all the courses, notably at those for working men, the numbers present at them each evening being from twelve to fifteen hundred. There were also three courses of lectures delivered in neighbouring towns-Armagh, Portadown, and Antrim-the lecturer being Mr. W. B. Morton, M.A., Jun. F.R.U.I., assisted by Mr. John Wylie, B.A., the subjects being Electricity and Magnetism, and the attendances good. The Society also assisted in arranging two courses of lectures for Sligo, which came off with large success, the lecturer being Mr. H. Macaulay Fitzgibbon, who had previously lectured most acceptably at the Belfast centre. At the close of each course an Examination was held at which prizes and certificates were awarded. All the lecturers expressed themselves as much pleased with the answering at these Examinations and at the progress of their students generally. I cannot but think that the Belfast Society for the Extension of University Teaching supplies a felt want among us, and renders a service to the cause of higher education which could not otherwise be easily supplied.

THE JUBILEE OF THE COLLEGE.

The College attains its Jubilee this year, the Letters Patent incorporating it having been issued on December 30th, 1845. It would of course be unpardonable to allow an occasion so interesting to pass unnoticed, and the Council have accordingly resolved that it shall be fittingly celebrated, not on the precise date of the Jubilee, which would not for many reasons be a convenient or suitable time, but in the course of next year, the exact period to be announced hereafter. We shall hope to see as many of our alumni as possible coming from the scenes of their various labours in many different places to join with us, and with the citizens of Belfast and Ulster generally, in celebrating the completion of the first half century of the existence of an institution which has, during its comparatively brief life, conferred countless blessings not only on the Province of Ulster but on many places besides—an institution which the Vice-Chancellor of the Royal University fittingly described at the Commencements of that University last autumn, as "the greatest glory and pride of the northern province."

I have thus briefly sketched the proceedings of the College during another year of its history. Further information regarding it will be found in full detail in the Appendix to this Report, where I have placed lists of the Visitors, the President, the Professors, the Deans of Residences, and other Officials of the College, together with a series of tables showing (1) the Number of Students matriculated in the Session 1894-95; (2) the Numbers and Religious Persuasions of the Students who have entered in each year since the opening of the College, and the Numbers and Religious Persuasions of the Students who have attended in each year; (3) the Numbers attending in each Faculty during the Session now ended ; (4) the Number of Students who came to the College from each of the provinces of Ireland, and from other places, during that Session; (5) the Ages of the Students in attendance; (6) the Number of Lectures given by each Professor during the Session, and the Number of Students attending each Class; (7) the names of the College Scholars and Prizemen for last Session; (8) a list of Degrees, Diplomas, and Honours obtained by Students of the College at the Examinations of the Royal University of Ireland in 1894; (9) a list of sundry Students who have, since 1st January, 1881, obtained distinctions in Universities other than the Royal University of Ireland; (10) a Table showing the Length of Service, Salaries and other Emoluments of the Professors and Officers of the College; (11) a List of the Benefactors of the College since its foundation, with an account of their benefactions; and (12) an account of the Receipts and Expenditure of the College during the year ending 31st March, 1895. This Exhibition was awarded for eleven years.

- 1864. Given by the Royal Academical Institution, Belfast, two Exhibitions of Five Pounds each, to be conferred annually upon students from that Institution who have taken the highest places in the Literary and Science Divisions, at the Examination for Scholarships of the First Year.
- 1866 Given by John Charters, Esq., an Exhibition, value Fifteen Pounds, and two Exhibitions, value Ten Pounds each, in the Literary Division of the Faculty of Arts; also one Exhibition, value Fifteen Pounds, and two, value Ten Pounds each, in the Science Division of the Faculty of Arts, to be called the "Charters' Exhibitions," and to be annually awarded during ten years, at the Examinations for the Literary and Scientific Scholarships of the first year, to students who, during at least one year previous to their entrance into college, have been in continuous attendance at the Royal Academical Institution, and who have attained the standard of excellence required at the Junior Scholarship Examinations. Also, an Exhibition, value Fifty Pounds, tenable for one year, to be called the "Charters' Medical Exhibition," to be annually awarded during ten years, in connexion with the Belfast School of Medicine, by the Trustees of the "Charters' Educational Fund."

An oil portrait of William Burden, M.D., former Professor of Midwifery in the College; presented by the subscribers.

1868. Bequeathed by Robert Sullivan, Esq., LLD., Barrister-at-Law, the sum of Four Thousand Pounds for the endowment of Three Scholarships in Queen's College, Belfast, to be called the Sullivan Scholarships, two of them to be restricted to candidates who shall have acted as Teachers or Assistant Teachers in Irish National Schools for at least two years, and one of them to candidates who shall have been educated in the Royal Academical Institution, Belfast, for at least three years.

These Scholarships are tenable for three years.

1869. Given by William Coates, Esq., a prize, value Thirty Pounds, to be called "The Coates Prize," and to be awarded in the Department of Engineering to the best candidate in a set of Examinations, to be held in the Third term of each Session, and to comprise :---

1. Civil and Mechanical Engineering.

2. Office and Field Work, including Geometrical Drawing and Surveying, Levelling and Measuring, together with any two of the following subjects:

3. Natural Philosophy applied.

4. Analytical Chemistry.

5. Geology.

6. Mathematics, including specially the elementary principles of the Differential Calculus.

Competition for this Prize in each Session to be open to all persons who are at the time, or were in the preceding year, Students of Engineering in Queen's College, Belfast, going through the Third Session of their Engineering Course, in regular order, or going through the Session which, under the sanction of the Council, in special cases shall stand instead of a Third Session of the Queen's College Engineering Course.

This prize was awarded for four years.

- 1869. A Bust of the Rev. P. Shuldham Henry, D.D., late President of the College, presented by the Professors and other subscribers.
- 1871. An oil portrait of George L. Craik, LLD., former Professor of History and English Literature in the College, and also a photograph group of some of the Professors; presented by Messrs. Marcus Ward & Go.
- 1871. Bequeathed by John Porter, Esq., the sum of Three Thousand One Hundred and Ten Pounds Eight Shillings and Four Pence for the endowment of Two Scholarships in Queen's College, Belfast, to be called "The Porter Scholarships." These scholarships are each of the annual value of Fifty Pounds, and are tenable for two years. They are open to undergraduates of not less than two years' standing.
- 1873. A deed was executed by William Dunville, Esq., establishing the "Sorella Trust."

This deed, which also provides funds for other educational purposes not connected with the College, endows two Studentships in Queen's College, Belfast, to be called "The Dunville Studentships." These studentships are open to any person who is recognised by the Council or other Governing body of Queen's College, Belfast, as a student of three or more years' standing in any Faculty, provided that the last of the three or more years which give such standing, has been spent in Queen's College, Belfast, and has been the year preceding, or the year but one preceding the examination.

They are given, one, for the encouragement of the study of Mathematical and Physical Science, the other, for the encouragement of the study of Natural Science, in alternate years. Each person obtaining a Studentship receives £45 for the first year, and £100 for the second year.

1873. Given by the Widow and Children of the late John Robinson M'Clean, Esq., Civil Engineer, London, through the hands of the Rev. P. S. Henry, n.n., the late President, the sum of Five Hundred Pounds, to be expended in the purchase of Scientific works for the Library of Queen's College, Belfast. Anno.

- 1874. (liven by the Methodist College, Belfast, one Exhibition, value Ten Pounds, to be awarded annually to the highest answerer among students from the Methodist College who have obtained Literary Scholarships of the first year in Queen's College, Belfast; and another Exhibition, also value Ten Pounds, to the highest answerer among students from the Methodist College, who have obtained Science Scholarships of the First Y ear in the same College.
- 1876. Given by the Reverend Arthur Hercules Pakenham, for the endowment of two Scholarships in Queen's College, Belfast, one to be called the "Sir Hercules Pakenham Scholarship," and the other the "Emily Lady Pakenham Scholarship," the sum of One Thousand Pounds, invested in five bonds of £100 each of the Moscow Jaroslaw Railway Company, and five bonds of £100 each of the Charkoff Azov Railway Company.

These Scholarships are given in alternate years, are each tenable for two years, and are open to all students under 20 years of age, matriculated or non-matriculated, on their first entrance into the College.

1877. Given by an anonymous donor, Ten Pounds, to provide for an Entrance Prize of Five Pounds, to be awarded for proficiency in French.

This prize was awarded for two years.

The subscribers to a testimonial given to Dr. MacDouall on his returement from the Professorship of Greek, presented to the College, in addition to a portrait of Dr. MacDouall now placed in the Examination Hall, a collection of Classical and Oriental Works of the value of £275, selected from the library of Dr. MacDouall, to form the nucleus of a department of the Library to be called "The MacDouall Library."
