dated 1 March 1859;—for,

RETURNS “ of Name, Parish, and City or County of all MODEL FARMS and AGRICULTURAL SCHOOLS connected with the COMMISSIONERS; the Date of Connexion; the Extent of Land for Agricultural Purposes under each; the Name of the Landlord; the Nature and Terms of the Tenure; the Purchase Money, if any, paid in each case for the Land; the Annual Rent; Griffith's Valuation of each Farm; Total Amount expended up to the 31st day of December 1857 upon each Farm and School for Agricultural Purposes exclusively, with the Amount received from Farm Produce, Boarders' Fees, &c., in each of the Schools managed by the Commissioners themselves; Net Total of the Amount expended on Agriculture out of the Public Grants made to the Commissioners, from the Introduction of Agricultural Instruction to the 31st day of December 1857; Valuation of all the Property held by the Commissioners in connexion with Agriculture, classified under Heads, such as Capitalised Interest in Land, Value of Buildings, Machinery, Implements, Live Stock, Crops, &c.; and distinguishing the Valuation of the Central Model Farm, or Albert Institution, *Glasnevin*, on the 31st day of December 1857:”

“ And, of the Total Number of AGRICULTURAL BOARDERS who had resided in those Establishments up to the 31st day of March last, and of the Number of those who were then connected with NATIONAL SCHOOLS, distinguishing the Numbers in the Central Model Farm, *Glasnevin*, from the others, and stating in each case the Numbers of each Religious Persuasion; of the Numbers then remaining connected with National Schools, state in how many of these is Agricultural Instruction given.”
