My dear Sir,

Queen's University, 12 October 1862.

You doubtless know of the munificent endowment founded yesterday by Sir Robert Peel of three Exhibitions of 40*l.* each, tenable for one year.

Candidates not more than 22 years of age, who have attended the second year's course in Arts at Galway, who have not attended the lectures of the Curriculum for the degree of B. A., for more than two years, can compete. Our Exhibition, along with which a scholarship may be held, will be conferred on the best answerer at the approaching previous Examination, who fulfils the above conditions, provided he is placed by the Examiner in the first class.

I hasten to give you these necessary particulars without delay, although I have not time to write more fully.

The number of Scholarships tenable for one year, and appropriated to first, second, and third year Students in Arts respectively, is 10, and to fourth year Students is seven. A larger number was placed at the disposal of the second and third year Students in the Sessions 1850-51, and 1851-52, as the Government permitted the money not claimed for fourth year Scholarships to be so appropriated. In this College the Scholarships are tenable only for one year, and are competed for annually by the Students of corresponding standing. This, if not understood, would make the Scholarships appear to be thrice as numerous and expensive as they really are. They are not awarded unless there be positive merit to any candidate.
