OBSERVATIONS:

- A. I. Represents the amounts so far paid on account of erection of new buildings, for which the Estimate is £. 7,350, of which three-fourths has been already voted.
- A. 2. Embraces purchase, alterations and repairs of old building, law costs, rents, rates and taxes.
- B. Embraces Museum cases, fittings, collections, marbles, laboratory apparatus and materials, fuel, calculations, mapping, library and office expenses.
- C. Embraces salaries of director, chemist and assistant, clerk and housekeeper, porters and servants.

The Director of the Museum receives also salary as President of Queen's College, Cork, the duties of which office occupy at intervals about one-third of his time.

The Chemist of the Museum delivers courses of lectures on chemistry, which are paid for by pupils, or by institutions. These lectures are given in the autumnal recess.

The housekeeper has rooms in the Museum, and is allowed coals and candles.

The porters of the Museum receive a plain uniform and a slop dress annually.

The officers of the Museum, when travelling on the service of the Museum, are allowed necessary travelling expenses.

I have carefully prepared the calculations of the above stated amounts, and believe them to be correct.
