Permit the Irish Board of Works to make over to Trustees A.D. 1888.
any of the ruined Chapels of Clonmacnoice.

WHEREAS there are certain chapels, known as the chapels of Clonmacnoice, now in the custody of the Irish Board of Works :

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty,
5 by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

1. It shall be lawful for the Board of Works to transfer any one or more of these chapels to the custody of any trustees who may be
10 designated by a majority of the surrounding householders. Transfer of chapels to trustees.
2. The trustees to whom a chapel or chapels are transferred are to engage to use such chapel or chapels solely for religious
uses. Engagement by trustees for chapels to be used only for religious purposes.
3. A petition signed by a majority of the householders of the
15 parish in which the chapels are situated, or in such adjoining parish as the Board of Works may designate, may be held proof of the wishes of the majority of the householders, and the Board of Works are to be sole judges as to whether the petition is so signed by a majority of assentors.
