THEREAS there are certain chapels, known as the chapels of Clonmacnoice, now in the custody of the Irish Board of Works:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, 5 by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

1. It shall be lawful for the Board of Works to transfer any one Transfer of or more of these chapels to the custody of any trustees who may be trustees. 10 designated by a majority of the surrounding householders.

2. The trustees to whom a chapel or chapels are transferred by trustees are to engage to use such chapel or chapels solely for religious be used only uses.

3. A petition signed by a majority of the householders of the Petition of 15 parish in which the chapels are situated, or in such adjoining parish as the Board of Works may designate, may be held proof of the wishes of the majority of the householders, and the Board of Works are to be sole judges as to whether the petition is so signed by a majority of assentors.
