THIRTEENTH REPORT.

REPORT of the Comptroller and Auditor General upon the Account of the Commissioners of Church Temporalities in *Ireland*, from 1st January to 31st December 1880; prepared and submitted to Parliament in pursuance of the 37th Section of the Act 32 & 33 Vict. c. 42.

FOLLOWING the practice of previous years, I have to point out that when my examiners were recently in Dublin it was ascertained that the following mortgages were not ready for inspection, because they had not then been completed by the purchasers:—

which bears favourable comparison with the arrears noted in last year's Report, which were then 324.

Collection Account of Tithe Rent, Land Rents, &c.

The arrears in the collection of Tithe Rent are still increasing, both as regards the Tithe Rent-charge and the fixed annual instalments of purchase money of Tithe Rent. The fixed half-yearly instalments of Mortgage Money on purchase of Land Rents also show a large increase.

Expenses of Commission. . A clerk on the establishment of the Irish Church Commission has been, since the 4th of December 1880, and is now, employed on duty solely connected with the "Inland "Navigation Commission, Ireland" (Class VII., Estimates 1881-82), and his salary, 230 L per annum, has been paid out of the Irish Church Funds; a substitute employed by the Commissioners

Commissioners during his absence at 1 l. 11 s. 6 d. per week being paid "out of the Vote "for Temporary Commissions." The salary of the former should, in my opinion, be paid out of the Vote for Temporary Commissions, and that of the latter out of Irish Church Funds. The opposite course having been followed, the Irish Church Commissioners are paying 230 l. a year for the services of a gentleman who is employed in the office of the "Inland Navigation Commission," and get in return a substitute for whom the Navigation Commission pay only about 80 l. per annum.

In reply to a communication addressed to the Irish Church Temporalities Commissioners, they have informed me that the Treasury have sanctioned the employment of this officer in the service of the Inland Navigation Commission, and the payment of his salary

out of the Irish Church Funds.

The 6th section of the Irish Church Act authorises the Treasury to fix the salaries of persons employed for the purposes of the Act, but it does not seem to me to empower their Lordships to sanction their employment in other Departments, nor the payment of

their salaries while so employed out of the funds of the Irish Church.

It appears also that the Inland Navigation Commissioners occupy a portion of the offices of the Irish Church Temporalities Commissioners, and in reply to an inquiry whether they contribute towards the rent, taxes, &c., as is usual in such cases, the Irish Church Temporalities Commissioners have informed me that "no arrangement has been " made whereby the Inland Navigation Commission shall contribute towards the rent "and taxes, &c., of 24, Upper Merrion-street."

On examination of the bog rental for 1880, it appears that one of these bogs has been Bog Rental for the

sold for 200 L, and the others, 19 in number, for which the purchase money has not been year 1880. specifically credited, have been discharged from the rental, in the margin of which is

noted the following observation :-

"The Commissioners have no bog land remaining unsold in any of these glebes."
They proceed to remark that the bogs were so undefined, that it was found to be necessary to sell them in "connection with the tenants' holdings, either to the tenants

themselves, or where they did not purchase to the public."

"In either case the value of the holdings was augmented by the bogs, and the Com-"missioners obtained a return for the allowances made to clergymen at commutation in "the increased price they received for the holdings." In reply to a request that the Commissioners would furnish me with some evidence that the purchase money received for the holdings included the value of the bogs, they have informed me that they cannot furnish me with any evidence further than the statement "that such was the " case."

I have no reason to doubt the correctness of the statement, but I am unable to corroborate it.

The long-pending disputes between the Irish Church Temporalities Commissioners and Mr. Ball's costs and their late solicitor, Mr. John Ball, have, as far as regards the legal proceedings, been emoluments. brought to a conclusion by an Order of Her Majesty's Court of Appeal in Ireland, of 3rd of July 1880, on a memorandum in writing, or consent on both sides.

A correspondence, which originated with me, has passed with the Irish Church Temporalities Commissioners relative to the omission of certain conditions from the consent. This correspondence, which will be found in the Appendix, fully explains the grounds on which I consider that the Commissioners, in the settlement of this matter, have

practically assumed powers which were vested by the Act in the Treasury alone.

As the consent referred to was made an Order of Court on the 3rd of July last, I recently inquired of the Commissioners whether any steps had been taken towards carrying out the conditions of the Order, and in reply I was informed that Mr. Ball had done all he undertook to do, except refunding the costs in respect of the advowson of Clonegal (not in dispute), and the approval fees received by him under the circumstances stated in my Report on the Account, 1879, page 4. It would therefore appear that the decision of the Court of Appeal, given eleven months ago in so far as regards its financial results to the Commission, still remains unexecuted.

Upon Motion of Counsel for the Commissioners of Church Temporalities in Ireland, by way of Appeal made unto this Court on the 21st, 22nd, 23rd, and 27th days of April 1880, from the order of the Queen's Bench Division of the High Court of Justice in Ireland, bearing date the 20th day of June 1879. Whereupon, and on reading the Notice of Appeal, dated the 10th day of July 1879, the said order of the Queen's Bench Division, and on hearing what was alleged by the said counsel, and by counsel on behalf of the prosecution, this appeal was ordered to stand for judgment, and the same coming on this day in the presence of said counsel, and counsel on behalf of the said prosecutor. John Ball, informing the Court that the parties had agreed upon the terms of an order to be pronounced on this appeal, and having handed in a memorandum in writing consented to on both sides for that purpose,—It is ordered, in pursuance of said consent, that the said order of the Queen's Bench Division of the High Court of Justice in Ireland, bearing date the 20th day of June 1879 be, and the same is hereby discharged without costs upon the terms following, that is to say: The prosecutor, the said John Ball, undertaking to abandon all claims against the Commissioners in respect of alleged wrongful dismissal, and to withdraw the protest under which he paid over the costs of actions, and abandon his claim to the costs of transcripts, and to hand over to the Commissioners, on oath, all documents of the Commissioners or relating to their business in his possession, and pay over the costs received by him in respect of the Advowson of Clonegal, after deducting outlay, and to file an affidavit stating the amount received in respect of Perpetuity Grants approved of by him since the 1st January 1871, and to lodge the amount appearing upon such affidavit to be in his hands in the Bank of Ireland to the credit of the Commissioners, and the Commissioners of Church Temporalities in Ireland on their part undertaking to withdraw their letter of the 31st May UPON Motion of Counsel for the Commissioners of Church Temporalities in Ireland, by way of Appeal

21st instant, transmitting a copy of the order of Her Majesty's Court of Appeal in Ireland, in re The Queen at the prosecution of John Ball v. the Commissioners, dated the 3rd day of July 1880.

On perusing this order, which appears to have been made upon terms agreed to by the parties, the Comptroller and Auditor General cannot discover that provision has been made for the repayment to the Commissioners of the sums improperly retained by Mr. Ball on account of mortgages prepared by him on their health.

The Commissioners, on the 29th May 1877, transmitted to the Comptroller and Auditor General a copy of a letter addressed by them to Mr. Ball on that day, in which they informed him that before they could recommend him for a Pension, "they must in the first place require him to hand over to them all costs, "without exception, which have been received by him for services performed for them since the 30th "September 1875, his attention being specially called to the costs of preparation of mortgages." They added, "The Commissioners, before they can make any further recommendation with respect to your pension, "must also require you to comply with their directions, to furnish the certificate called for by the Comptroller and Auditor General in December 1875, and subsequently referred to in his letters of the "11th March and 16th May 1876."

As the costs for the preparation of mortgages form probably the great halls of the monies improperly

As the costs for the preparation of mortgages form probably the great bulk of the monies improperly retained by Mr. Ball, and as the Comptroller and Auditor General stated in his Report on the Account for 1879, a copy of which was forwarded to the Commissioners on the 31st May last, that the certificate had not been furnished, and that it was desirable that it should be insisted upon, I am directed to request that you will be so good as to inform the Comptroller and Auditor General why these essential conditions upon which the recommendation of the Pension was to be made were apparently abandoned. In the case of the certificate the Comptroller and Auditor General thinler that the commission should have with of the certificate the Comptroller and Auditor General thinks that a communication should have, with reference to the terms of his Report, been made to him before the conditions of the order were agreed upon; and in the case of the costs it is conceived that the Commissioners should have obtained the anction of the Treasury, because the retention of these costs by Mr. Ball is, as stated by their Lordships, in their letter of 30th September 1975, "only another form of paying to him from the funds of the "Commission a sum in excess of his salary of 1,500 l. for all his services to the Commission."

In the letter above referred to, and in their Lordships' letters of 21st January 1874 and 24th May 1877, they emphatically insist that that amount should not be exceeded, and in the last letter they remark, "When my Lords in May 1871 agreed that Mr. Ball's remuneration, covering both salary and "office expenses, should be fixed at 1,500 L per annum, they were under the full impression that he would be paid nothing further except in the way of reimbursement."

As the retention of these costs is a practical augmentation of Mr. Ball's salary, and as the 6th section of the Irish Church Act, 1869, confides the approval of the salaries of the officers of the Commission to the Lords of the Treasury, the Comptroller and Auditor General directs me to request that you will be so good as to inform him whether the apparent agreement that Mr. Ball shall retain these costs has

received their Lordships' sanction.

Irish Church Temporalities Commission, 24, Upper Merrion-street, Dublin, 3 August 1880. In reply to Mr. Treherne's letter of the 23rd July, with respect to the order recently made by the Court of Appeal in Mr. Ball's case, I am directed by the Commissioners to state that there was no reason in their opinion for consulting either the Lords of the Treasury or yourself previous to the settlement of their controversy with Mr. Ball, the question of sanctioning his pension still remaining in the hands of

When once that controversy had become the subject of legal proceedings, it was proper that the Commissioners should be strongly influenced as to the course they should thereafter take by the advice of their counsel, and further that they should as far as possible act as was thought right by the court before

which the case was tried.

The case having been submitted to the Court of Appeal, the opinions neither of the Lords of the Treasury nor of the Comptroller and Auditor General, nor of the Commissioners, had any weight beyond that attached to them by the Judges composing the Court, who had ample means of knowing what those opinions on all the points at issue were, from the arguments of counsel, and from the "Appeal books" laid before each of them, containing, as those books did, the several affidavits filed, together with the whole correspondence in the matter.

After a trial which lested foundary the Master of the Bolls, anothing for himself, and from the

After a trial which lasted four days the Master of the Rolls, speaking for himself and for the other Judges, stated what the conditions were on which they thought that the subjects in dispute might be settled, and those conditions did not include either the payment by Mr. Ball of the costs he had received for the preparation of mortgage deeds, or the giving of the certificate demanded by the Comptroller and

Auditor General.

In consequence of the observations made by the Court, the Commissioners' counsel recommended that the whole case should be settled on, substantially, the terms indicated by the Master of the Rolls, and the Commissioners considering in the first place, and chiefly the opinion expressed by the Court, and considering also that every point originally insisted on by them, save the payment of the sums received for mortgages, and the furnishing of the certificate, was to be conceded by Mr. Ball, and bearing in mind further the expense to the public of protracted litigation, as the case might have been taken to the House of Lords, acquiesced in the recommendation of their counsel.

The terms of consent were then made the order of Court, a copy of which was sent to you.

The Commissioners have directed a copy of this correspondence to be sent to the Lords of the

Treasury.

On the points excepted, Mr. Ball has not complied with the order of the Court of Appeal, and the Commissioners consequently have not withdrawn their letter of the 31st May 1877 to the Lords of the Treasury, and have not yet renewed their recommendation that a pension should be granted to Mr. Irish Church Temporalities Commission.

Pursuant to the provisions of the Act 42 & 43 Vict. c. 74, s. 3, the Commissioners of Church Temporalities in Ireland became liable to the Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt for the sum of One Million Three hundred thousand Pounds Sterling to establish the above Fund, such sum to be charged on the Surplus.
