AT A VESTRY held 27th August 1827, agreeable to notice,—It was Resolved, to borrow the sum of £.4,615. from the Board of First Fruits, for the purpose of building a Chapel of Ease in this Parish, the same to be repaid by instalments, at the rate of Four Pounds per centum per annum, the parishioners having agreed to applot the same.

AT A VESTRY held 27th December 1827, agreeable to notice, for the purpose of applotting the Grand Jury Cess of last Michaelmas Term,—It was Resolved, That the proportion of the Grand Jury Warrant, payable by this Parish, being £.2,025. 10. 2. together with £.1,375. 7. 0. arrears, be applotted on the householders, at the rate of Three Shillings and Nine Pence British on each Irish Shilling of the Minister's money.
