IRISH EDUCATION INQUIRY.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY:

W E propose in this our Second Report, to lay before Your Majesty, an Abstract of the Returns, which we obtained in the year 1824, from the Protestant and Roman Catholic Clergy in Ireland, of the state of Education in their respective Parishes.

IN the execution of the Commission with which we were intrusted, it was our first proceeding to address a Circular Form of Return to the Parochial Clergy of the Established Church, and also to the Roman Catholic Priests, and to the several Presbyterian Ministers; as it appeared to us desirable that an opportunity should be afforded of comparing information derived from sources independent of each other. Nor have we been disappointed in the result; for, although instances of disagreement will be found to occur, on the whole, they have been fewer and less important than could reasonably have been expected in an undertaking of this nature; and the comparison of the several Statements will increase the authority of each.

In order to give the strongest sanction to the Returns, we have, in the exercise of the power committed to us by Your Majesty, thought it proper to call on each person making them, to verify them by swearing, That he had inquired with due and reasonable diligence into the matters contained in the Return; and that the Statement therein made, as to each head respectively, was the truth, according to the best judgment that he had been able to form upon the subject.

We regret that we cannot exhibit the Returns made by the Presbyterian Ministers, in such a manner as to render them the subject of comparison with those obtained from the Clergy of the Established Church, and from the Roman Catholic Priests. This, however, is not possible, as the limits of the Presbyterian congregations are not determined by parochial boundaries. We have, however, to express our high sense of the value of the information which we have derived from their communications.

In the Appendix will be found an Abstract of the Returns obtained from the Clergy of the Established Church, and from the Roman Catholic Priests respectively, in as compressed a form as we can-adopt; it being scarcely possible, from the great extent of the originals, that they should themselves be published at length.

We shall next advert to the several Societies, which have of late years been engaged in supplying the means of Education in Ireland, and shall point out the number of Children in attendance in their several schools.

With respect, however, to the numbers specified in these Returns, it should be observed, that the opposition on the part of the Roman Catholic Clergy to Schools in which, by the regulations of the different Societies, the Scriptures were required to be read, was exerted with peculiar activity during the year 1824, to which period the Returns have reference; there is no doubt, therefore, that in the earlier part of the year there had been a fuller attendance in the Schools belonging to those Societies; and it is probable that the Children which had been withdrawn from such Schools, had increased the numbers in others.

[•] In a Return made by us to the House of Commons, on the 20th March last, pursuant to an Order of the House, we stated the number of Schools as returned to us by the Protestant and Roman Catholic Clergy, in connexion with the Kildare-Place Society, to be 852, containing 52,404 Scholars. It is necessary, however, to observe, that by far the greater part of the Returns above abstracted, were made in the autumn of 1824; and there is reason to believe (as we have before stated generally with respect to all Schools, in which by the regulations of the different Societies the Scriptures are required to be read) that in consequence of the exertions of the Roman Catholic Priests, these Schools, at the period when the enumeration was taken, were not so fully attended by the Roman Catholic Children as in the earlier part of the year.

The Society subsequently transmitted to us a List, dated June 1825, of every School in connexion with them on the 5th of April preceding. We have inserted this List in the Appendix to this Report. There are 1,517 Schools contained in it: 900 of these Schools are included in the Returns made to us by the Clergy, and 617 are not included in them. We have set forth in the Appendix, a List specifying the 900* which are included, and also a List specifying the 617 not included. It will be observed, that the difference between the Returns of the Clergy and the List of the Society, consists principally in this, that the Returns of the Clergy include only such Schools as they found open and in operation, in the autumn of 1824; whereas the List of the Society includes Schools to which they had granted or agreed to grant aid, and which were therefore upon their books, although not going forward. At the time when the Returns of the Clergy were made to us, some Schools were temporarily closed, some had been closed for a considerable time, but it was hoped would be revived; some had not then commenced, and some were entered upon the books of the Society, after the Returns of the Clergy had been sent in.

The three classes of Schools last above mentioned, contain altogether, according to the Roman Catholic Returns, 422 Schools, and 46,963 Children.

These Schools are under the immediate sanction and superintendence of the Roman Catholic Clergy. The Education is almost universally gratuitous, and is so strictly Roman Catholic in its character, that although Protestant children are not excluded from the Schools, few are found to attend them.

XI.-Pay Schools.

These Schools cannot be considered as being under any particular superintendence. They arise, from time to time, as circumstances create a demand for them; and are frequently undertaken by persons very ill qualified to discharge the duties of Schoolmasters.

The Parish Schools, established under the provisions of the Act 28 Henry VIII. c. 15, and subject to the superintendence of the Clergy of the Established Church, cannot, for the purposes of this enumeration, be considered as constituting a distinct class, as they will all be found to rank under one or other of the classes before specified.

Their Total number, as stated in the Returns, was 827; and of these 180 were connected with the Association for discountenancing Vice; 39 with the Trustees of Erasmus Smith; 188 with the Kildare Place Society; and 94 with the London Hibernian Society. The rest of the Parish Schools are not distinguishable from the ordinary Pay Schools of the country; except that the Church Catechism is taught in them to the children belonging to the Established Church, and the master receives a small annual stipend, usually of 40s. from the minister of the parish by whom he is in all such cases appointed.

The Enumeration and general classification of the Schools of Ireland above given, does not include Sunday School Institutions, which now remain to be noticed.

IT appears by the evidence of Mr. La Touche, the Secretary of the Sunday School Society, that the number of their Schools in March 1824, was 1640; and that they contained about 157,184 Scholars, who were instructed gratuitously by 12,578 voluntary Teachers of both sexes.

The managers of this Institution are all Protestants. We have no means of ascertaining the respective numbers of the children of the different religious persuasions.

There is also extensive catechetical instruction given on Sundays, in the Roman Catholic chapels.

The practice appears to be very general, especially in the Roman Catholic districts.

In these Schools, as already stated in our First Report, the children are taught their prayers and various catechisms; sometimes by the Roman Catholic school-masters of the vicinity, who are collected for that purpose, and sometimes by young persons, of both sexes, under the inspection and direction of the Roman Catholic priests. The con-fraternities, which form the Society, denominated The Sodality of the Christian Doctrine, are particularly employed for this purpose. The number of children so instructed we have no means of ascertaining.

It would, however, be a mistake to consider all the children instructed, either in the Protestant or Roman Catholic Sunday Schools, as constituting an addition to those who attend the day Schools above enumerated. A very large proportion of the children, no doubt, attend some of the other Schools also, but many of them receive no other instruction than that which the Sunday Schools supply.

There are some other points of view, under which it may be desirable that the Schools of Ireland should be now considered.

The first is, as to the extent of Local Patronage that is exercised in their direction and superintendence.

The resident Gentry of Ireland, and the Clergy of all descriptions, have, of late years, evinced an increasing interest on this subject; and at the time of making the Returns, there were founded by individual patrons, and wholly supported by them (exclusive of Sunday Schools:)—

These details afford a striking illustration of the extent to which local patronage and superintendence is employed; and of the willingness of the patrons to accept the aid, and conform to the regulations of the several societies, according to the views they may entertain of the merits of their respective systems.

IT appears to us also to be important to ascertain, in what degree the reading of the Scriptures formed a part of the various instruction, which is thus supplied to the lower ranks of the Irish people.

ANOTHER point of view in which Education in Ireland may be considered, is, the rapidity of its progress.

In 1811 the Commissioners of Education, in their Fourteenth Report, expressed their opinion that the number of Schools in Ireland was about 4,600, attended by about 200,000 children.
