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REPORT.

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR GRACIOUS MAJESTY,

1. We, the Commissioners of Charitable Donations and Bequests for Ireland, humbly submit to your Majesty this our Fifty-seventh Annual Report.

2. Since our last Report 21 meetings of the Board have been held. We have made 365 orders in various matters affecting charities and charity property, besides providing for the regular issue of the sums payable to the charities under our control.

3. Six hundred and fifty-six funds for various charitable purposes have been lodged with us from time to time, since the "Charitable Donations and Bequests Act (Ireland), 1867," enabled Trustees to make such voluntary transfers.

In addition, we receive rents and annuities of the yearly value of $\pounds 2,430$ 12s. 9d., and the annual interest on certain Charity Funds amounting to $\pounds 12,973$ 1s. 10d., not vested in us.

5. Our Charity Accounts for the year ended 31st December, 1900, were duly audited by the Local Government Board Auditor, and declared correct. The Accounts for the year ended December 31st, 1901, have been prepared and submitted for audit.

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FIFTY-SEVENTH REPORT OF THE COMMISSIONERS

6. As questions have been addressed to us by His Majesty's Government relative to the St. Leger Aldworth Endowment, Newmarket, County Cork, we think it right to mention that the income of its fund ($\pounds 10\ 2s\ 8d$.) available for agricultural and technical instruction is so small that the Local Administrators have been unable to utilize it for some time past. Accordingly we addressed a communication on the subject to the Board of Agriculture and Technical Instruction, and they have replied stating that a general scheme of technical instruction for the County of Cork is being at present formulated, and that when the scheme is in operation it might be pointed out to the persons interested that the Endowment could, with advantage, be utilized either to pay the entrance fees of girls joining a residential school for domestic servants, or for some similar purpose.

7. Upon the application of the Corporation of Dublin, we have agreed to cede to them our interest as trustees of the estate of Peter Bertrand's charity, in a small plot of ground in St. Kevin's Road, Dublin, to be added to the public street, having satisfied ourselves that it would be for the benefit of the rest of the charity property.

8. On the application of the Trustees for the Christian Brothers, Wexford, we sanctioned a sale to the Urban Council of Wexford of a plot of ground, vested in trustees for the Christian Brothers, the Urban Council being desirous of erecting a Technical School upon the premises which were not required by the Christian Brothers.

9. Under the Leases for Schools (Ireland) Act, 1881, we authorised the Trustees of the First Lurgan Presbyterian Congregation to lease a small plot of ground in the town of Lurgan at a nominal rent to the Commissioners of National Education in Ireland, for the purpose of having Male and Female National Schools erected thereon.

10. Under the Educational Endowments (Ireland) Act, 1885, we have made several important orders during the past year. In the case of the Monaghan Collegiate School which was practically inoperative owing to want of funds, we have sanctioned the sale of the old School house to the Monaghan County Council, who have acquired it for the purposes of a Technical School, and we have directed the purchase money to be applied in accordance with the trusts of the Endowment.

Upon the application of the Commissioners of Education in Ireland, we made an Order amending the Scheme of the Ulster Royal School in certain particulars, but in this, as in another case, we refused to amend the Scheme so as to empower the Governing Body to alter certain portions of it from time to time, being of opinion that sec. 18, 48 and 49 Vic., cap. 78, only enables alterations to be made by the Board itself.

In the case of the Pembroke Technical School we made an order altering the Scheme, and constituting the Urban District Council of Pembroke the Governing Body of the School (in place of the old Governing Body), and vesting the School buildings and the property of the Endowment in the Urban District Council.

We have altered the Scheme of the Creggan School, Londonderry, by appointing the Select Vestry of the Parish of Templemore Governors of the School: the name of which we have changed to "The Templemore Schools;" and we have sanctioned the sale of the old School premises to the Select Vestry of Christ Church, Londonderry, to be used by them as a National School.

The house and premises situate at 1 Upper Merrion Street, Dublin, lately used by the Hibernian Marine Society for a Boarding School for the Education and training of boys for the Royal Navy or Merchant Service, having been acquired by His Majesty's Government, we sanctioned the removal of the School of the above Society to a site at Clontarf, where a plot of ground consisting of over six acres has been secured, on which it is proposed to erect school buildings at a cost of £5,000.

 \sim 11. The vacancy in the Office of Junior Counsel to the Board, caused by the resignation of Mr. Daniel F. Browne, K.c., on being called to the Inner Bar, has been filled by the appointment of Mr. George C. Green.

12. At the request of the Board of Works, we have consented to allow the Board of Agriculture and Technical Instruction to use the second floor of the house No. 2 Kildare Place, occupied as our offices, upon the understanding that such occupation shall not exceed one year,

13. Accounts of the sum voted by Parliament have been furnished by us, in accordance with the forms adopted under the direction of the Treasury, and the provisions of the "Exchequer and Audit Departments Acts, 1866"; and our Appropriation Account for the year ended 31st March, 1901, has been certified to be correct by the Auditor-General of Public Accounts.

All which we submit as our Report, and in testimony thereof we have caused our Corporate Seal to be hereto affixed this 9th day of July, 1902.
