

Column 5.—The amount of 13,990,005t, was the total on 25th or 31st March 1904, of the outstanding leans of certain school boards which had not before the latter data been abolished under the Education Act, 1902. The amount of 300,224t, was the total on 29th September 1903, of the outstanding leans of all other school boards in existence on 31st March 1904. The amount of the outstanding leans at the end of March 1904 of the last-mentioned school boards has not been ascertained.
