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# INTRODUCTORY AND EXPLANATORY OBSERVATIONS.

## LOCAL TAXATION IN IRELAND, 1904-5.

The sums applied to purposes of local government in Ireland during the year 1904-5, excluding loans, and grants provided by Statute, and making the necessary deductions for duplicate entries in the local accounts, amounted to £4,013,303, a decrease of £35,197 as compared with the preceding year.

Of this amount 73 per cent. was raised directly by the taxation of lands, buildings, &c., 13 per cent. was derived from tolls, fees, stamps, and dues, 5 per cent. came from rents of property in lands, houses, &c., and the remaining 9 per cent. consisted of various miscellaneous items of local income classed as other receipts.

The total of these four branches of revenue, the sum first mentioned above, is regarded as the amount of the local taxation of the year, but, with respect to revenue other than that produced by rates, it is to be noted that the class of local taxes known as tolls, fees, stamps, and dues is obviously restricted in range of operation, and to a great extent is, practically, payment for value received, while the income arising from rents, and from other receipts, is not the produce of any tax, but is dealt with as such in its application to local expenditure. It will be seen, hereafter, also, that there are included under this last-named head the profits of certain reproductive undertakings in the hands of local bodies,\* representing 3·5 per cent. of the total revenue of the year.

The table on next page gives the amount received from each of these sources during 1904-5, £2,952,771 as rates, £510,064 as tolls, &c., £185,180 as rents, and £365,288 as other receipts, and it may be seen that compared with the preceding year there was a decrease in poor rate of £109,255 and in other receipts of £11,637, while municipal and other rates showed an increase of £68,718, tolls, &c., of £12,398, and rents of £4,579.

The amount produced by rates, in which is included about £97,240 raised in respect of water supplied for domestic and other private purposes (3·3 per cent. of the whole),\* represents an average of 3s. 10½d. in the pound on the rateable valuation of Ireland at the beginning of the year,† and an average of 13s. 5d. per head of the population as estimated at the middle of the year.‡

A net sum of £3,304,539 obtained from local sources, including rates to the amount of £2,900,535, was applied towards the expenditure of counties and towns during the year. This was supplemented by payments made from the Local Taxation (Ireland) Account to the extent of £1,287,266, and by further sums derived from the Imperial exchequer amounting to £29,565, so that of the total revenue of county and town authorities 72 per cent. came from local sources, and 28 per cent. from grants. On an average the grants were equivalent to 1s. 9d. per pound of rateable value, and to 5s. 11½d. per head of estimated population. The Agricultural Grant of £727,337§ a year is usually equal to 24 per cent. of the whole revenue of the county councils, and its effect on the rates of 1904-5 for county, union, and district charges, in the case of each rural district, can be ascertained from a table given in the appendices.||

The expenditure of the local bodies charged to revenue and capital during the year amounted to £6,908,347, being £53,583 less than their total receipts from all sources. Of this expenditure a sum of £1,049,061, or about 15 per cent., was applied to the discharge of borrowed moneys and the payment of interest on such moneys.

# LOCAL TAXATION.

The indebtedness of the local bodies on account of loans and stock at the end of 1904-5 amounted, as may be seen by a table on page 19, to £16,917,091.\* Of this, £7,447,011 appertained to municipal authorities, being an increase of £5,788,769 since 1878, the year in which the first of the existing code of Irish public health statutes was enacted. The municipal indebtedness includes £677,536 in respect of schemes for the housing of the working classes†, while for similar schemes in rural districts the indebtedness stood at £2,413,873, of which details will be found in column 19 of the table commencing on page 36.

Of the amount of other receipts in the foregoing table (£365,288) £267,892 appertained to county and town authorities, and the Belfast Water Commissioners, of which, a sum of about £144,384, 3·5 per cent. of the total receipts of the year, was derived from the profits of undertakings in the hands of local bodies, while a further portion thereof amounting to £53,094 was received in respect of Government property. These profits and receipts are referred to in the following paragraphs (a) and (b).

(a) UNDERTAKINGS IN THE HANDS OF LOCAL BODIES.

*Gas, and Electric Light.*

The income derived from the gas and electric light undertakings in the hands of certain town authorities is dealt with in the returns of local taxation in the following manner. The accounts of these undertakings are usually kept apart from the ordinary municipal accounts, and, unless otherwise applied, any profits which have accrued on a year's transactions, after providing for public lighting, are placed with miscellaneous receipts in aid of taxation. The total amount of these profits included in other receipts is £38,432.

*Water.*

The receipts connected with water undertakings in the hands of local bodies are two-fold,—those produced by poundage rates assessed on valuation, and those arising from sales of water, water rents, &c. The amount of the latter included in the other receipts of 1904-5 is £105,952. The sums produced by public and domestic water rates are included in the amount given as rates in the table on the preceding page, but these rates are not always shown separately in the local accounts, and therefore it is not possible to determine with strict accuracy the amount produced by each of them. From a careful estimate, however, it appears that of the total amount of such rates appearing in the accounts of the year, viz., £165,927, a sum of £97,240 was for water supplied for domestic and other private purposes, being 3·3 per cent. of the total amount raised as rates during the year.

*Tramways.*

Since the expiration of the year dealt with in the last returns of local taxation the tramway system in Belfast has been purchased by the Corporation of that city, this being the only case in Ireland in which tramways constructed in a municipality are the property of the local authority. The purchase took place as from the 1st of January, 1905, in pursuance of the Act 4 Edw. 7, ch. ccxxix., and the period of account in connection with the undertaking embraces, therefore, only three months of the year dealt with in these returns. The receipts during the period exceeded the payments by £7,178, of which a sum of £2,159 was contributed to the general purposes fund of the Corporation—the balance being applied, mainly, in payment of interest on moneys borrowed.

(b) BOUNTY IN LIEU OF RATES ON GOVERNMENT PROPERTY.

The contributions\* annually made by the Treasury to the local taxing authorities as bounty in lieu of rates on Government property have always been included in other receipts,—these sums not being raised locally as rates. The amount of such contributions in the accounts of the local bodies for 1904-5, is £53,094, of which town authorities received £42,954, and county authorities, £10,140.

For the years included in this table the average amount of the Belfast water rate included in column 2 was £39,052, and of the Rutland Square tax (Dublin) £302.

The valuation in force at the time the rates, of which the produce is given in col. 3, were assessed was, in each case, that for the preceding year.

#### CLASSIFICATION OF LOCAL TAXATION.

The various branches of local taxation in Ireland are classified hereinafter in the following manner, and such explanatory observations as appear to be necessary are given in each case.

- I. County taxation.
- II. Town "
- III. Taxation in districts chiefly municipal, but levied by Authorities other than municipal in certain cases.
- IV. Receipts of Burial Boards.
- V. Receipts of Joint Drainage Boards.
- VI. Taxation arising from Fees, Stamps, Fines, Dogs Licence Duty, &c.
- VII. Taxation produced by Tolls, Dues, &c.
- VIII. Receipts on account of the Mercantile Marine Fund.

#### I.—COUNTY TAXATION.

Each administrative county, other than the county boroughs hereinafter referred to, comprises a number of rural districts,\* varying from three in Carlow, Longford, and Louth, to eighteen in Cork,—the total in all the counties being 213.† Sixty-five of the rural districts are co-extensive with poor-law unions, and there are forty-eight other cases in which the union is confined to a single county, and therefore includes one rural district. Of the remaining forty-six unions, thirty-eight extend into two counties and eight into three, the former including two rural districts each, a total of seventy-six, and the latter three, a total of twenty-four.

The ordinary expenses of a county are provided for by means of a rate on each rural district, known as poor rate, which the county council is empowered to make once a year and collect in equal half-yearly moieties. The sums raised by this rate form portion of the fund from which all county expenditure is defrayed, including payment of the moneys required by boards of guardians, councils of rural districts, and the committees of lunatic asylums.

For expenses other than the foregoing, viz., payments in connection with charges for sewerage, water supply, or other public health undertaking, guarantees for railways, harbours, &c., compensation for criminal injuries and the cost of extra police, which are known as separate charges, special rating areas are prescribed, and the sums required for these purposes are separately estimated and raised by a separate item of the poor rate assessed on the special area in each instance. The area of charge in respect of a public health undertaking may consist of the whole, or part only, of a rural district, while in the other cases mentioned it may include the whole county, or be restricted to a portion of the county. The number of rating areas for separate charges at the present time, other than rural districts, is 508.

Rates are also made by county councils for the following purposes:—under section 19 (1) of the Agriculture and Technical Instruction (Ireland) Act, 1899, they are empowered to raise by means of the poor rate, for the purpose of agriculture and other rural industries, a sum equal to a rate of one penny in the pound over the whole of the rural districts comprised in their respective counties, congested areas being excluded if the councils in such cases so desire.\* They are also required by section 4 of the Public Libraries (Ireland) Act, 1902, to provide the moneys which rural district councils, who have adopted the Public Libraries (Ireland) Act, 1855, may find to be necessary for the purposes of that enactment, by means of a rate not exceeding one penny in the pound, to be levied, in each case, over the whole rural district. These rates are in addition to the maximum rate of a penny authorized by the Technical Instruction Act, 1889; the area on which such rate is levied being specially prescribed, as in the case of a public health undertaking.

The rate on each rural district for the ordinary expenses of the year ended the 31st of March, 1905, and the items included therein for county at large, union, and rural district charges, as levied on agricultural land and on other hereditaments, are shown in a table on pages 64 to 71. The rate for separate charges in each case where the rate is levied over the whole area comprised in a rural district, is also given in the table, together with the amount collected in each district during the year for general purposes, and for separate charges, and the total for each county. The amount collected in each county also appears with the other county receipts on page 20.

The poor rate collected in the counties during the year amounted to £1,502,195, being £65,574 less than in 1903-4, the grants paid from the Local Taxation (Ireland) Account, which appear in the county accounts, amounted to £1,212,746, and the total receipts, exclusive of loans, to £2,964,298, a decrease of £45,662 on those of the preceding year.

The expenditure from revenue came to £2,959,961, being £6,150 more than in the preceding year, but it will be seen by the table on pages 22 and 23 that there was a considerable decrease under several heads of outlay. The chief specific increase was in respect of roads, £11,421, and there was also a large increase, £23,509, in the road expenditure defrayed from loans, as is shown in column 21 of the table.

In addition to the amount shown in the foregoing summary as having been paid by the county councils to boards of guardians, viz., £1,002,620, it will be seen by Table II of the appendices that further sums, amounting to £204,962, were paid by the councils of the county boroughs to the guardians whose unions are partly included in these boroughs. In like manner it will be seen that the payments to committees of lunatic asylums by the councils of counties and of county boroughs amounted to £391,299, and £109,432, respectively.

## II.—TOWN TAXATION.

The provisions of the Towns Improvement (Ireland) Act, 1854, have not been adopted in any case since the last Returns of local taxation were issued, and the number of towns under municipal government consequently remains at one hundred and twenty-four. Eleven are boroughs constituted under the Municipal Corporations (Ireland) Act, 1840 (3 & 4 Vic., cap. 108), six of these being administrative counties called county boroughs; one hundred and four are under the Towns Improvement (Ireland) Act, 1854 (17 & 18 Vic., cap. 103); and there are nine under special local Acts. Lists of the towns, classified accordingly, will be found in tables II., III., and IV. of the appendices.

Ninety-five of the towns are urban sanitary districts,§ including three towns constituted as such in 1905, viz., Ballyclare, in County Antrim, and Donaghadee and Newcastle, in County Down. The urban sanitary districts, now known as urban districts, are the eleven boroughs, the nine towns under local Acts, and seventy-five of those under the Towns Improvement Act. The governing bodies of these districts possess full administrative powers with respect to sanitary matters, they are the sole rating authorities within their respective jurisdictions, and they are, moreover, road authorities, and, as such, share in the grant provided by the Probate Duties (Scotland and Ireland) Act, 1888. They receive recoupment, also, in respect of the salaries paid to their sanitary officers, and, for the promotion of

technical instruction, grants are made to them, in aid of approved schemes, by the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction. The amount allocated under this head for the county boroughs is £26,000 a year, and for counties and urban districts £25,000.

The six county boroughs, as already mentioned, are administrative counties in themselves, but other urban districts, although free from county jurisdiction, are liable to contribute to certain branches of county expenditure. The liability in this respect of such urban districts as have been dealt with by the Local Government Board, under section 71 of the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898, as amended by section 3 of the Act of 1901, and sections 3 and 13 of the Act of 1902, and the financial relations generally between counties and these urban districts, can be ascertained from a table in the appendices.\*

The twenty-nine towns† which have not been constituted urban sanitary districts are subject, as regards matters pertaining to public health, to the control of the councils of the rural districts in which they are respectively situated,—the governing bodies of these towns having no administrative powers under the Public Health Acts. However, by adopting Part III. of the Housing of the Working Classes Act, 1890, as in the case of urban districts, they can obtain power to provide lodging houses for the working classes, pursuant to section 99 of that Statute, and for this purpose the sections of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, which apply in the case of urban authorities, are made applicable to them by section 1 of 59 and 60 Vic., cap. 11. In the following towns of this class schemes for the housing of the working classes have been put into operation:—Ballyshannon, Boyle, Callan, Mullingar, Newbridge; and preliminary steps for a like purpose have recently been taken by the Town Commissioners of Bantry. A later enactment, section 21 of the Public Health Act, 1896, extends to Town Commissioners the power to establish and regulate markets conferred on urban authorities by section 103 of the Public Health Act, 1878.

A table is given in the appendices showing for each urban district the latest poundage rates and those for the preceding year,—the latter being the rates of which the produce is dealt with in these Returns,—the amount of poor rate collected, the population, valuation, area, &c.‡ Similar information with respect to rates, valuation, population, &c., in towns which are not urban districts, will be found in table XXIX. of the appendices.† As regards these towns, however, it is to be noted that the rates in the table are for municipal purposes only, and that, in addition, each town is liable for the rate on the rural district in which it is situated, and, further, if the town is included in an area of charge for any of the special purposes mentioned in the first paragraph on page 10, it is also liable for the rate required to meet payments in connection therewith.

The present rateable valuation of the urban districts amounts to £4,243,339, and of the towns which are not urban districts to £123,937, making a total of £4,367,276, from which it appears that property amounting to more than one fourth part of the rateable valuation of Ireland (£15,466,564)§ is included in areas subject to municipal government.

#### RECEIPTS AND EXPENDITURE OF TOWN AUTHORITIES.

An abstract of the receipts and expenditure in each town during the year ended the 31st of March, 1905, will be found in the appendices.¶

All the receipts are grouped in Part I. of the following table in order to facilitate comparison, and obtain a general view of the finances of the different classes of town authorities, and they are divided into (1) rates for municipal purposes; (2) poor rates made and collected by urban councils; (3) tolls and market charges, dues, and fees; (4) rents; (5) other sources of income, including receipts from gas and water undertakings; (6) borrowed money and stock issued; (7) grants from the Local Taxation Account; and (8) payments made by other local taxing bodies.

The purposes to which the receipts are applied are shown in Part II.

### III.—TAXATION IN DISTRICTS CHIEFLY MUNICIPAL, BUT LEVIED BY AUTHORITIES OTHER THAN MUNICIPAL IN CERTAIN CASES.

#### (a.) BELFAST WATER RATE.

The Belfast City and District Water Commissioners are empowered to levy the following rates in connection with the water supplied by them to the City of Belfast and certain adjacent districts:—A domestic water rate not exceeding 1s. 8d. in the £, and a public water rate equal to one-fourth part of the domestic rate, subject to a proviso that the latter in certain cases shall not exceed 2d. The rates assessed for the year ended the 31st of October, 1904, were 1s. 4d. and 4d., respectively.

The receipts and expenditure of the Commissioners for that year are shown in table VI. of the appendices, and they are summarized as follows:—

#### (b.) RUTLAND-SQUARE TAX (DUBLIN).

The Governors of the Rotunda Hospital levy a tax under 25 Geo. 3, cap. 43 (Ireland), sections 20 and 21, on the occupiers of the houses on the east, north, and west sides of Rutland-square for the purpose of lighting those sides of the square, and for keeping the railings of the enclosure in repair,—the balance being applied towards the maintenance of the hospital. The tax is a charge on each house in the square of 1s. 9d. per foot of the frontage thereof, with a fixed annual payment by the residents for each light or lamp in front of their houses. The receipts on account of this tax in the year ended the 31st of March, 1905, amounted to £278 8s. 6d., and the other receipts to £5 5s. 0d., of which a sum of £128 13s. 8d. was applied to purposes of lighting, and £100 8s. 7d. towards wages, repairs, &c., leaving a balance of £54 11s. 3d. available towards the maintenance of the hospital.\*

#### (c.) TAXATION IN AID OF THE COST OF POLICE.

A rate of 8d. in the £ is assessed within the police district of Dublin Metropolis under Section 4 of the Act 1 and 2 Vic., cap. 25, in aid of the cost of the Dublin Metropolitan Police. By section 66 (4) of the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898, it is provided that the produce of this rate shall be paid to the Commissioner of Police, by the council of the city of Dublin as regards so much thereof as is raised in the city, and by the council of the county of Dublin as regards so much as is raised outside the city.

The amount produced by the police rate, together with the sums received from publicans' and pedlars' certificates, &c., for the year ended the 31st of March, 1905, are given in table VIII., of which the following is a summary:—

## 16 TAXATION IN CONNECTION WITH PORT AND DOCKS BOARD (DUBLIN.)

The cost of police in Ireland is charged on Imperial funds, but, in addition to the foregoing local charges in aid of the Metropolitan force, there are sums produced by local taxation which are applied in aid of the amounts voted by Parliament for the maintenance of the Royal Irish Constabulary, as follows:—

In any county in which a force of the Constabulary in excess of the allotted quota is found to be necessary, one-half the cost of such extra force is charged to the County Council; and it will be seen by table I. of the appendices that the sums paid for extra police in counties in the year ended the 31st of March, 1905, amounted to £816, a little more than one-half the amount in the preceding year.

The only charge on town funds for police occurs in the county boroughs of Belfast and Londonderry, the charge being made for one-half the cost of an extra force, and for services rendered by the Constabulary in performing the duties of a night watch. The cost of police to these boroughs, which is regulated by Statute in each case, amounted in the former to £20,748, and in the latter to £1,133 for the same year.

The charge to local sources for the cost of police in Ireland in 1905 would, therefore, appear to have amounted to £74,428, that is about 5 per cent. of the total cost; the sums voted by Parliament for the two branches of police service for the year ended in March, 1905, amounting to £1,437,569, viz., £97,961 for the Dublin Metropolitan Police, and £1,339,608 for the Royal Irish Constabulary.

### (d.) TAXATION IN CONNECTION WITH THE PORT AND DOCKS BOARD, DUBLIN.

The cost of preserving and repairing certain quay walls and bridges in the city of Dublin is provided for by a tax levied within the police district of the Metropolis under the Act 17 Vic., cap. 22, and the repayment of loans obtained for the erection and maintenance of two bridges over the River Liffey, amounting to £118,765, is effected by means of a "bridge rate" levied under 39 and 40 Vic., cap. lxxxv., upon the "bridge area" as therein defined. It is expected that these loans will be discharged in May, 1906, and thenceforward this rate will cease to be imposed, and the provisions of the first-named Act will apply in regard to the maintenance of the two bridges. As in the case of the rate levied in aid of the Dublin Metropolitan Police, section 66 (4) of the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898, provides that the produce of the bridge rate (usually 1d. in the pound) shall be paid to the Port and Docks Board by the council of the city of Dublin as regards so much of it as is raised in the city, and by the council of the county of Dublin as regards so much as is raised outside the city. The sums so paid by these bodies, respectively, during the year ended the 31st of December, 1904, were £1,327 12s. 1d. and £294 17s. 9d., as may be seen by table IX. of the appendices.

## IV.—RECEIPTS OF BURIAL BOARDS.

Under section 160 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, and sections 29 and 33 of the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898, the Councils of urban and rural districts are the burial boards for their respective districts.

There are also eight joint burial boards constituted under Section 12 of the first named Statute, the accounts of which are summarized in table XIV. of the appendices.

The receipts of urban burial boards are included in the town returns given herein, and those of rural burial boards in the miscellaneous local receipts included in the rural district fund appearing on page 6. The fees and other receipts, of joint burial boards and of rural burial boards during the year were as follows:—

## VI.—TAXATION ARISING FROM FEES, STAMPS, FINES, DOGS LICENCE DUTY, &amp;c.

This species of taxation is applied partly to the remuneration of officers of local courts, and partly in aid of county and town rates, as appears hereafter.

The officers styled Clerks of the Peace and Clerks of the Crown, whose salaries are charged on local rates, are now reduced in number to five of each as shown in tables X. and XI. of the appendices. In the remaining counties and boroughs these offices have been united as provided for by the County Officers and Courts (Ireland) Act, 1877, and an appointment has been made to the united office of a person styled Clerk of the Crown and Peace, whose salary is paid out of funds provided by Parliament.

The salaries and retiring allowances of the clerks of Petty Sessions are charged on the fund produced by Crown fines and the sale of Petty Sessions stamps, and in order to secure the fund from variation by reason of the fluctuation which necessarily occurs in the amounts received from these sources, the Registrar of Petty Sessions clerks is authorized

by the Act 44 & 45 Vic., cap. 18, to deduct from the Dogs Licence Duty, mentioned in the next section, such sum as the Lord Lieutenant may order for any calendar year, and to add it to the fund.

(d.) *The Dogs Licence Duty.*

The collection of the dogs licence duty, 2s. for each animal with 6d. for the registry of each licence, is entrusted to the Petty Sessions clerks, and a return of it is made to Parliament by the Registrar of Petty Sessions clerks, so that a very brief summary only is given as table XIII. of the appendices. A considerable part of the remuneration of Petty Sessions clerks is derived from the dogs licence duty, as mentioned in the preceding section. The particulars of these repayments have been supplied by the Commissioners of Public Works. The repayments made by proprietors of lands amounted to £54,856, and the sum repaid out of county rates was £1,686, as may be seen by table XIX. of the appendices.

Tables XXII., XXIII., XXIV., XXV., and V., respectively, give in detail the amounts due on account of loans and stock by county councils, committees of lunatic asylums, town authorities, the Belfast City and District Water Commissioners, joint drainage boards, joint burial boards, harbour authorities, and rural district councils, at the close of the financial year ended on, or before, the 31st of March, 1905. In county taxation the other receipts on page 10 have been reduced by £17,483, received from the Dogs licence duty, £6,781 received from the General Cattle Diseases Fund, and £26,156, which was not part of the taxation of the year; in town taxation the other receipts included in the table on page 14 have been reduced by the following sums :—£4,210 received from Petty Sessions Stamps and Crown fines, £3,020 from the Dogs licence duty, £858 received from the General Cattle Diseases Fund, and further sums amounting to £46,795. In harbour taxation the receipts on page 18 have been reduced by £13,303, and in the cases of the union fund and the rural district fund on pages 11 and 12, sums of £3,272 and £2,010 have been deducted, respectively.
