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Appendix The amount of the Preparatory Grade Prize Fund paid to managers of schools on account of the Examinations in 1907 was £1,906.

FINANCE.

The period, ten years, for which interest at $2\frac{\pi}{4}$ per cent. payable by the Irish Land Commission, and guaranteed by the Treasury, on our original endowment of £1,000,000 sterling, expired in February in the present year. Negotiations with the Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt and the Land Commission have resulted in the exchange of our Bonds for £1,000,000 for £1,123,595 10s. 1d. Irish Land Guaranteed $2\frac{\pi}{4}$ Stock.

Our income from this source will amount to £30,898 17s. 6d.

INSPECTION.

We deeply regret, in the interests of education, that the earnest request, conveyed in our Report for 1906 and in previous Reports, that your Excellency would be pleased to sanction the appointment of a permanent staff of Inspectors has not yet been complied with.

We think it right to repeat what was stated on the subject in our Report for 1906 as follows:—

1906.

- * "In spite of the discouraging results of their efforts hitherto, the Board feel bound once more to call the attention of His Excellency to the urgent necessity of establishing a permanent system of inspection.
- "For many years members of the Board have been impressed with the inadequacy of examination alone to provide a satisfactory test of the efficiency of School work; and at the unanimous request of the Board, in the year 1898, it was endowed with the powers of a Commission to take evidence, and report on the practical working of the system of Intermediate education, established by the Act of 1878. The evidence given before the Commission of 1898 amply confirmed the views thus entertained; and the Report of that Commission, in 1899, recommended the introduction of a system of inspection.
- "The Report was approved by the Lord Lieutenant; and the Act of 1900 authorised inspection, although the question whether the results of inspection should have a share in determining the award of the School Grant was made to depend on the practical working of the experiment.
- "In order to test this, in the year 1901, six temporary inspectors, with the sanction of His Excellency, were appointed by the Board; and the results of their work were so satisfactory, that the Board unanimously were of opinion that, subject to the limitations of the Act, inspection should at once be organized on a permanent footing. The Rules of 1902 accordingly prescribed that bonuses of from 10 to 20 per cent. on the School Grant should be payable to schools reported respectively as 'Satisfactory,' or 'Highly Satisfactory,' by the inspectors. This Rule received the sanction of the Lord Lieutenant, and thereby acquired the force of a statute, and thus rendered inspection obligatory on the Board.
- "In December, 1902, the Irish Government professed that it was entirely in favour of a system mainly founded on inspection." This approval has remained for more than four years purely formal; and the Board have been left in the humiliating position of having been permitted to make a rule which they are prohibited from carrying out.
- "It is unnecessary to recite once more the history of the fruitless negotiations which have been carried on since 1902. When the reports of the temporary inspectors encouraged the Board to ask for the appointment of a permanent staff their communications were sometimes barely acknowledged for six months, or were met by a postponement of the question for another year. When the Government at last were able to Printed image digitised by the University of Southampton Library Digitisation Unit

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give any serious consideration to the question, the Board were asked to submit proposals for diminishing the cost of examinations, as a set-off to the superadded cost of inspection, and to define the duties of the inspectors in relation to the examiners. It was evident that, so long as the general examination prescribed by statute had to be maintained, although some economies might be effected, it was impossible that a reduction in the cost of the examination, such as the Government seemed to demand, could be made, nor, without some experience of the double system, could the relations of inspectors to examiners be determined with any accuracy. But the Board have steadily kept before them, and repeatedly pressed on His Excellency, the urgent necessity of introducing a system of inspection within the limits of their powers, which, after the practical experience of a few years, might become a substantial factor in testing the efficiency of Intermediate Schools in Ireland.

"Into the reasons of policy which have prevented the Irish Government from giving practical effect to the views which they professed to entertain, it is not for the Commissioners to enter. But they venture to suggest that the uncertain prospect of wide administrative changes can hardly be taken to justify a neglect of urgent educational reform, and a disregard, year after year, of the clearly-expressed will of the Legislature. This enforced stagnation of policy, the Board do not hesitate to say, is now severely condemned by cultivated opinion in Ireland: it is perpetuating a false and corrupting conception of the real ends of education; and it is sacrificing the highest interests of large numbers of pupils whose gifts would respond to a more elastic and skilful treatment. Fortified by the best expert advice, this Board feel bound once more to demand from the Irish Government permission to carry out a legal obligation, and to perform a duty to education which has been too long postponed.

In view of the clearly expressed opinion of the Government, there is no need to enlarge on the subject in detail. No general examination by papers, however skilfully and carefully conducted, can by itself, and without the safeguard of a thorough system of inspection, afford a sufficient and satisfactory test of the efficiency of teaching on all sides. It may appraise the value of certain rather crude material results which can be numerically estimated, but it fails to correct the defective and even injurious methods by which those results Our temporary inspectors, in their are often obtained. rounds in 1902, observed in some schools grave defects in the mode of teaching. And year after year, our examiners in their reports are pointing out the same faults of slovenly haste and thoughtlessness, defective grounding, and ignorance of the very rudiments, which are not only fatal to solid progress in any subject but fatal to real mental culture. These defects are being constantly exposed, and they as constantly reappear.

"Examination, when properly applied, is undoubtedly a valuable aid in education. But a single uniform examination of thousands of pupils by paper only, as we are bound to conduct it, unaccompanied and unchecked by inspection, can never eradicate faulty methods of teaching; it is a question whether it does not tend to perpetuate them. Examination in Languages without viva voce can never be a satisfactory test. And viva voce examination in all subjects, in the case of junior pupils, is absolutely necessary to correct and supplement the results of examination by papers.

" Moreover, a single examination in the year, proposed as the sole criterion of scholastic efficiency, especially with large pecuniary results depending on it, sets before pupil and teacher a false and demoralising idea of the ends of education. The true educator values, far above any accumulation of mere facts, proper method and discipline of the intellect in attaining knowledge. He will think far more how a thing is learnt than how much is learnt. The mediocre teacher is always aiming at quantity rather than quality; he is always spurring the memory, and neglecting the powers of judgment, reflection, and taste. And it is the more mechanical powers, rather than those of reflection and refined discrimination that a great general examination by paper, can chiefly test. And when large pecuniary rewards are attached to success in such a trial, the evil is intensified. The hurry and excitement of commercial life are imported into years which, under proper guidance, should be years of tranquil growth, stimulated by the unbribed curiosity which is natural in the best young minds, till we quench it by our unskilful methods. It is painful to think of the waste of fine talent, both in teachers and pupils, which is encouraged, if not demanded, by our present mistaken system.

"It is needless to enlarge on the services which a properly organised and guarded system of inspection might render to our school life. It would leave the headmaster, though of course liable to criticism, large freedom in the choice of the subjects and methods of instruction which he found best for the special circumstances of his pupils, and congenial to his own tastes and powers. It would dispel the pernicious idea that the highest end of school life is to pass an examination, and to win so many pounds sterling.

"Proper inspection would embrace large departments of school life which no examination can possibly touch. It should, of course, deal with the number and qualifications of assistant teachers, and the methods of teaching, the timetable and distribution of work, the system of promotion and of discipline. The moral tone and manners of the pupils would not escape the notice of a vigilant inspector. He would pay special attention to the character of the school-buildings, with reference to health and good order, the capacity and ventilation of class-rooms, the provision of libraries and read-

ing-rooms, and the arrangements for games and recreation. He would, in short, embrace in his survey the whole life of a school, not as a place merely for imparting knowledge, but as a training-ground of mind and character, to form men and women to bear their part in many various scenes of life. Not his least important function would be to confer with the authorities of a school on questions of general management. to discuss with the head teachers problems of organisation and the direction of studies, and, in friendly conversation with the assistants, to suggest improvements in method, or to elicit explanations of any defects which might have been noticed. The inspector who is really fitted for his duties, while he will not spare sloth and inefficiency, will have immense opportunities of stimulating improvement by gentler means. schools will regain their freedom. And the heads of schools. within wide limits, will be able to follow those ideals of education most congenial to their own powers, and best adapted to the requirements of their particular locality.

"It is satisfactory to know that, partly as the result of the temporary inspection carried out under this Board, partly from the success of inspection by the Department of Technical Instruction, the prejudice against inspection, which formerly prevailed in many quarters, has to a great extent disappeared. Messrs. Dale and Stephens, when they visited the schools in 1904-5, found "the objections to it quite exceptional." Indeed, the immediate establishment of such a system is now loudly demanded by a considerable body of opinion. Everything is ripe for the change. If it be longer deferred, it will have to be made, not as the result of deliberate statesmanship, but in obedience to angry clamour. This Board would therefore respectfully beg His Excellency to sanction the immediate exercise of powers which have been definitely entrusted to them by Parliament."

APPENDIX VI.

THE BURKE MEMORIAL PRIZES.

A sum of money, subscribed in memory of the late Thomas Henry Burke, Esq., Under Secretary to the Lord Lieutenant, was transferred by the Burke Memorial Committee, on 18th March, 1884, to the Intermediate Education Board for Ireland, who undertook to administer the Fund in accordance with the following Rules—(the sum funded is £1,222 18s. 11d. Consols):—

- I. The annual income from the fund shall be applied in paying three Prizes, one of £16, one of £10, and a second of £10; any surplus or deficiency to be apportioned in the same ratio. If, in the opinion of the Commissioners, sufficient merit be not shown by the Candidates competing to justify the award of any or either of the Prizes, the amount of such Prize may be, at the discretion of the Board, withheld and added to the principal.
- 11. No student shall be qualified to receive these Prizes except the children of persons who are or have been, in receipt of salary or pension in Ireland, paid out of money derived from Parliamentary Grants, Rates or Taxes, other than members of the Naval or Military Services not being also in Civil employment.
- III. The Prizes shall be awarded as follows:—that of £16 to the Boy whom, at the annual Examination in the Junior Grade among Male Candidates qualified in the manner expressed in the next preceding Rule, the Board shall adjudge to have obtained the highest aggregate of Honour marks in the subjects in which he presented himself for examination; One Prize of £10 to the Boy whom, in the same Grade at such Examination, the Board shall adjudge to have obtained the next highest aggregate of Honour marks in the subjects in which he presented himself for examination; and the other of £10 to the Girl whom, at such Examination in the same Grade, among Female Candidates in the manner aforesaid, the Board shall adjudge to have obtained the highest aggregate of Honour marks in the subjects in which she presented herself for examination.
- IV. The decision of the Board shall be final and decisive in determining whether the Candidates fulfil the conditions of the third Rule.
- V. The Board may deduct all expenses connected with the trust from the yearly income.
