TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY,

I have the honour of submitting to Your Majesty this Report of the condition and proceedings of University College, Galway, for the Session ended June, 1909.

The usual tables of statistics will be found in the Appendices.

The total number of students in attendance was 131, being 29 more than for the previous session. This substantial increase is mainly, if not altogether, due to the provisions made by Parliament for University Education in Ireland, and embodied in the Irish Universities Act, 1908.

Of these 131 students, 72 came from the province of Connaught, 57 from the other provinces of Ireland, and 2 from England. There were 14 women students.

The distinctions gained at the Royal University Examinations in 1908 were as follows :—

in addition to which the following three distinctions obtained at the same examinations by members of the College are worthy of mention :—
Thomas Walsh, B.A., M.B., was awarded the Medical Studentship,

with a gold medal for highly distinguished answering ; James Warnock, M.A., M.B., a gold medal for highly distinguished answering at the M.D. degree examination ; and Duncan MacLachlan, a scholarship in Mathematics.

These successes, taken in conjunction with many others which I and my predecessors in office had the privilege of reporting in the past, emphasise the justness of the claim of the College to adequate endowment and equipment at the present critical period in its history. Regard being had to all the attendant circumstances, no college in the Kingdom can show better results.

Past students of the College have, in the appointments and distinctions obtained by them during the past Session, given striking and conclusive evidence of the value of the University training received by them in the College.

Prof. J. A. McClelland has been elected a Fellow of the Royal Society. Miss Alice J. Perry, B.E., has been appointed to an Inspectorship of Factories, obtaining first place at the examination for that post.

Mr. Thomas Rea, M.A., late Junior Fellow, R.U.I., and Mr. Joseph J. O'Neill, M.A., have been appointed Inspectors under the Board of Intermediate Education in Ireland.

Mr. Philip C. Fogarty, B.A., obtained a high place at the examination for the Civil Service of India, and Mr. J. E. Bowen a Clerkship in the Exchequer and Audit Department.

Mr. Percy C. Austin has been appointed Lecturer in Chemistry in University College, Reading, and Mr. Arthur J. W. Compton, B.A., M.B., has been elected to an 1851 Exhibition Research Scholarship.

*Mr. John Moran, B.A., B.E., has been appointed to a County Surveyorship, and Mr. John Rorke, B.E., to an Assistant County Surveyorship.

Galway College has, since its foundation, and especially in recent years, taken a prominent position in the domain of scientific research.

Mr. William Goodwin, B.Sc., Ph.D., Lecturer in Chemistry at the Agricultural College, Wye, Kent, formerly Demonstrator of Chemistry and 1851 Exhibition Research Scholar of the College, has published a translation of Professor O. Kellner's work on "The Scientific Feeding of Animals."

Mr. P. C. Austin, M.A., is continuing his researches with Professor Haller in Paris. His Research Scholarship has been renewed by the Commissioners for the Exhibition of 1851 for a second. He has continued the work begun with Professor Senier in Galway, and has published a paper on "The Synthesis of Complex Acridines."

In my Report for the Session, 1907-1908, I ventured, in connection with some remarks on the Irish Universities Bill, to refer in the following terms to the needs of Galway College, and to the necessity of such capital and annual grants as would enable it to increase its usefulness as a seat of learning in the West of Ireland :—

"All friends of the College are watching with interest the progress of the Irish Universities Bill through Parliament, and the hope is universal that, under the new conditions, it may receive new life and vigour, and become to a fuller extent than ever it has been before a flourishing seat of learning in the West of Ireland. That this hope may be realised there should, I submit, be no niggardliness in the matter of capital and annual grants."

One of the pressing needs of Galway College is for new scientific laboratories. The College building is the same as it was when founded sixty years ago. At that time a Chemical Laboratory was provided, but it is much too small. From time to time rooms which had been used for other purposes were converted into laboratories, but the accommodation in them is utterly inadequate, and, at the best, they are only make-shifts. A new building is urgently required containing laboratories for Chemistry, Physics, Biology, Physiology, Electrical Engineering, Pathology, &c. The space in the College, now occupied by such laboratories as there are, could easily be utilised for other purposes, for which it is better adapted. The cost of erecting and equipping these laboratories, even on a modest scale, would be considerable. One laboratory alone might cost £20,000 or more. We do not, however, want expensive laboratories, but we want laboratories good enough to enable the College to compete with the new Colleges in Cork and Dublin. A student of science will always prefer a College where he can get good laboratory teaching.

"The additional annual grant must cover all additional annual expenses for the upkeep of new laboratories, the endowment of new Chairs, and the salaries of assistants and demonstrators. At present,

there is no provision for assistants or demonstrators, and at least three Chairs should be divided. One professor lectures both in Anatomy and Physiology; another in History, English Language and Literature, Logic and Metaphysics, and a third in Botany, Zoology, Geology, Mineralogy, and Physical Geography. New Chairs or Lectureships are required in Celtic, Modern Languages, Pathology, Electrical Engineering, and Agriculture."

The financial provisions of the Irish Universities Act, in so far as they affect Galway College, are in the highest degree disappointing to those who are acquainted with its history, its present condition of efficiency, and who realise what a loss it will be to the West of Ireland if it be compelled to enter upon its new career severely straitened and handicapped. Why it should have been so unfairly treated is difficult to understand.

It is to receive a capital grant of £6,000, a sum so small that, considering the pressing need for new and well equipped laboratories, it will be exceedingly difficult to spend it to the best advantage.

The annual grant of £12,000 which the College is now to receive may prove to be little, if anything, more than what it received in the past. The expense of the upkeep of buildings, formerly borne by the Board of Public Works in Ireland, must in future be paid by the College, and the pensions of present and future officers and professors will be a charge on College funds.

In the Statute made for the College by the Dublin Commission very little change has been made in the Chairs or in the stipends attached thereto. It makes a very scanty provision for the teaching of Irish, which is most unsatisfactory, as it is utterly insufficient to meet the wants of the most Irish-speaking province in Ireland.

No professorship or lectureship is provided in the subject of Agriculture.

I cannot close this Report without referring to the death of Sir Thomas Moffett, LL.D., formerly President of the College, and Professor of History, English Literature, and Mental Science. He exerted a powerful influence for good over all students who came into contact with him. He was connected with the College for over half a century, and much of its success is due to his untiring devotion to its interests.
