TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR GRACIOUS MAJESTY,

1. We, the Commissioners of Charitable Donations and Bequests for Ireland, humbly submit to your Majesty this our Sixty-seventh Report.

2. During the year ended 31st December, 1911, 27 meetings of the Board have been held. We have made 440 orders in various matters affecting charities and charity property, besides providing for the regular issue of the sums payable to the charities under our control.
