SIR.

We have the honour to submit the Report for the year 1917 on the Sea and Inland Fisheries of Ireland.

SEA FISHERIES.

FISH LANDED.

Excluding shell-fish, the quantity of sea-fish landed (663,000 cwts.), was greater than in any of the three preceding years, whilst the value of the catch (£646,000) exceeded by over 40 per cent. the figure of the previous year. Including shell-fish, tha total value exceeded £700,000.

As will be seen from the particulars given in Appendix No. 1, there was a falling off in the herring fisheries, but a great improvement in the mackerel fisheries.

VESSELS AND CREWS.

The following table shows the number of Irish boats and fishermen engaged in the fisheries in 1917 and the preceding year:—

INSURANCE OF FISHING VESSELS.

In December, 1917, H. M. Treasury finally approved of proposals put forward by the Department for the insurance of the hulls, machinery and gear of Irish fishing vessels against War Risks, and the Irish Fishing Vessels War Risks Insurance Committee was set up. Two members of the Committee are nominated by the Department. The rate of premium has been fixed at £2 per cent. per annum, and the risks covered are those generally understood by the term War Risks; but fishing gear, if insured, is free from claims except in case of total loss or general average. Owners of fishing vessels in non-congested districts were notified of the scheme in January last, and the number of boats in respect of which policies have been issued is 107.

During the same period, on the East Coast of Ireland, three claims have been paid for vessels and fishing gear lost, while ten boats not insured with the Committee have been sunk through enemy action.

LOANS.

During the year ended 31st March, 1918, fifty-three applications for loans, amounting in the aggregate to £11,507 17s. 8d. were received, and thirty-nine loans, representing £6,719 17s. 8d. were granted. Owing, however, to the fact that all the motor engines, &c., required had not been supplied by the end of the previous financial year, the amount actually issued was £8,332 17s. 6d. In about one-half of the cases the sums advanced were for the in-

stallation of motor engines in existing boats.

The promissory notes signed to secure principal and interest, inclusive of £8,176 19s. 11d. of unrepaid notes taken over by the Department at the commencement of their administration of fishery loans in non-congested districts, amount to £116,301 3s. 9d. The amount repaid is £89,689 5s. 9d., while securities on hands which have not yet matured for payment, represent £23,456 8s. 11d.

The total arrears of repayment of instalments stood at £1,465 4s. 3d at the end of the financial year, and the amount written off as irrecoverable is £1,690 4d. 10d. Of the last-mentioned sum, £1,103 0s. 10d is due to the failure of three owners of motor boats to respond to the efforts which our predecessors initiated in 1907, to increase the efficiency of the Irish fishing fleets by the introduction of internal combustion engines.

DUBLIN MARKET RETURNS.

The amount of sea-fish captured by trawl and hook which passed through the Dublin market during the year was 2,830 tons, being 117 tons more than that of the previous year.

The amount of imported fresh fish, excluding that mentioned in the

following paragraph, was 48 cwts. of haddock.

Besides the foregoing, there passed through the Dublin Market during the year 4,615 barrels and 12,405 boxes of Irish fresh herrings; 256 barrels of imported and 10 barrels of Irish cured herrings. The mackerel amounted to 8,414 boxes of Irish caught fish.

The quantities of salmon, trout and shell-fish passing through the Market are not recorded in a form capable of being reduced to a statisti-

cal statement.

SPRING MACKEREL FISHERY.

The season showed a slight improvement on that of the previous year as regards the quantity captured, which increased from 128,500 cwts., to 134,250 cwts., whilst, owing to the continued enhancement of prices, the value rose from £65,000 to £110,700. Owing to the great demand for fresh fish, the number of barrels of fish cured for export to America only slightly exceeded 3,500. As in 1916, the ports of Baltimore and Valentia were by far the most important centres, over one-quarter of the total catch being landed at the former place, and over one-fifth at the latter. Nearly 7,000 cwts. of mackerel were taken by boats fishing for herrings

out of Dunmore East, Co. Waterford. A table showing the results at the principal stations during the seasons of 1915, 1916, and 1917 is appended—

AUTUMN MACKEREL FISHERY.

The amount of mackerel captured during the Autumn of 1917—18, 198,000 cwts., was well above the average and greater than in any season since 1910—11. The value of the catch was £165,000, and nearly 38,000 barrels were cured for export to America. The results of the fishery in 1916–17 were 65,000 cwts., valued at £44,000, and, as will be seen from the appended table a great improvement took place at all the principal centres. It will be noted that at the stations on the Kenmare River and Dingle Peninsula, where the fish are landed at places remote from railway communication, the bulk of the landings was cured and the prices realised were lower than in more favourably situated districts.

SUMMER HERRING FISHERY.

The quantity and value of the herrings captured during the Summer Fishery were 180,000 cwts., and £150,500. The figures for the season of 1916 were 209,000 cwts., and £154,000. As will be seen from the appended table, the results at the Donegal stations, with the exception

of Burtonport, were not at all as good as in the previous year. Taken as a whole, the County Down ports nearly held their own, as did also Dunmore East, but a serious decline in quantity is noticeable at Howth.

WINTER HERRING FISHERY.

The results of the Winter herring fishery of 1917–18 were very bad, only 63,000 cwts., valued at £77,000, being landed, whereas in the previous Winter the figures were 110,000 cwts. and £93,500. The inshore fishing off the Counties of Louth and Dublin was a complete failure, as was also the season at Dunmore East. Although the captures by boats fishing from the County Donegal ports were not so large as in 1916–17, they amounted to nearly one-half of the total for the whole country. The quantities and values of the catches landed at the principal stations are as follow:—

Under the Sea Fishing (Ireland) Order, 1917, made by the Food Controller on the 31st August, 1917, the Department, on the 18th September, 1917, made an Order to the following effect:—

Suspending, during the months of January, February, March, October, November and December in each year, the operation of Section 7 of the Fisheries (Ireland) Act, 1842 (5 and 6 Victoria, Chapter 106), in so far as concerns the use between sunrise and sunset of drift nets for the capture of herrings in tidal and territorial waters off the coast of Ireland.

The maintenance of the statutory prohibition of the use of drift nets in the daytime is unsuitable to modern conditions of Winter herring fishing on certain grounds.

PIERS AND HARBOURS.

Progress was made with the schemes for the improvement of the harbour accommodation at Kilkeel (Co. Down) and Helvick (Co. Waterford). The works at Annagassan (Co. Louth) were completed. Some small repairs were carried out to the landing stage at Malahide. The facilities for navigation at Arklow Harbour were well maintained by the Dredger "Fag-an-Bealach," under arrangement with the Harbour Commissioners.

In continuation of the return given in previous Reports, it is recorded that there was no expenditure by the Commissioners of Public Works under the Sea Fisheries (Ireland) Act, 1883, in the year ended 31st March, 1918

SHELL FISHERIES.

Officers appointed by the Department exercised supervision over the public oyster fisheries in Kinsale and Waterford Harbours, at Clarenbridge (Co. Galway), and at Inishlyre (Co. Mayo); over the mussel fisheries of Castlemaine Harbour, and the Escallop fisheries in Connemara.

NET MENDING.

The class in net-mending, which has been carried on in previous years at Kinsale, was continued during the Winter. The average attendance of pupils, all of whom came from the fishing population, was about 20.

No statistics are available of the quantity of seaweed used directly for manurial purposes.

By-LAWS.

Since the date of the last Report, Orders have been made defining the boundary between the tidal and freshwater portions of the River Carrowbeg or Westport River in the Ballinakill District, the River Moyour in the Bangor District, and the Dunglow River and Rivers flowing into the sea from Lough Meela and Maghery Lough in the Letterkenny District.

The above Orders will be found in Appendix No. 5, p. 26.

INLAND FISHERIES.

SALMON FISHERIES.

From the returns received from Railway Companies and othe sources, it would appear that the product of the salmon and trout fisheries was very much above the average.

The figures given in the last Report showing the annual capture by drift nets off the coast between Roundstone (Co. Galway) and Portrush (Co. Antrim) since 1905 are continued:—

Of 22,771 boxes of salmon received during the year at Billingsgate, 9,106 were from Ireland. In the previous year out of a total of 18,514 boxes, 5,992 were from Ireland.

From the reports received from the Clerks to the Boards of Conservators, it would appear that the weather was generally favourable to netting, and that the state of the salmon fisheries was satisfactory, except in the Ballina, Ballyshannon and Londonderry Districts. The number of grilse captured is still relatively small, but the shortage was, to a great extent, compensated for by the increased take of large fish.

Reports as to angling were, on the whole, disappointing, but in a few districts it was stated to have been good at the beginning of the season.

Cases of poisoning of rivers and the use of explosives to kill fish were again reported from the south-western districts, and destruction of fish continues to take place in the north as a result of the uncontrolled discharge into rivers of water in which flax has been steeped. There does not appear to be any material change in the number of other offences detected.

With the exception of the Bantry District, the number of breeding fish observed during the spawning season was equal to or greater than the number in the previous winter.

With a view to neutralising the limitations imposed by the change to Greenwich and "Summer" Time on netting operations in the evening in fresh waters, the Ministry of Food, on the recommendation of the Department, made an Order permitting such netting up to 9.25 p.m. in the evening.

The estimated output of salmon and trout fry from hatcheries in the season of 1917–18, which was much greater than in the previous one, was as follows:—Salmon, 4,218,500; Trout, 91,200.

Nearly 1,400,000 salmon fry were turned out from the Mallow and Banteer Hatchery.

The amount of Licence Duty received by the Boards of Conservators fell from £8,725 to £8,600.

Particulars of the captures during the year at certain of the more important Salmon Fisheries are as follows:—

Waterford District.

At Cahirpark Rod Fishery, on the River Sur, 43 fish weighing altogether $541\frac{1}{2}$ lbs., were taken.

At Neddin's Water, 20 fish, weighing altogether 292 lbs., were captured.

Lismore District.

At the Dromana Fishery, 664 fish were taken during the season.

The take of salmon and grilse at the Blackwater Fishery was 16 percent. below the average for the 25 years ended 1899. Salmon was 9 percent. below the average for the nine years 1891–1899, and grilse was 83 percent. below the average for the same nine years.

Kenmare District.

The capture at the Blackwater Fishery (Co. Kerry), was 33 per cent below the average for the 25 years ended 1899.

Waterville District.

The number of fish taken at Waterville Weir during the season was 872.

Killarney District.

The capture at the Laune Fishery below Killorglin Bridge was $32\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. below the average for the 24 years ended 1898.

Limerick District.

At the Newgarden, Prospect, Doonass, Castle, Hermitage, Woodlands, World's End and Summerhill Fisheries the total number and weight of fish taken were, respectively, 234 and 3,966\frac{3}{4} lbs.

Ballina District.

The capture of the Moy Fishery was 52 per cent. below the average for the 25 years ended 1899.

In respect of the year ended 31st March, 1918, the Department made grants, amounting to £2,173 12s. 6d., as specified below, to assist in the improvement and protection of inland fisheries.

The Fishmongers' Company continued to give effective aid in the suppression of the traffic in salmon and trout illegally caught in Ireland.

We desire again to express appreciation of the invaluable services rendered by the Officers and men of the Royal Irish Constabulary in the protection of the salmon fisheries.

Under the Fisheries (Ireland) Order, 1917, made by the Food Controller on the 30th July, 1917, the Department, after consultation with Boards of Conservators, made orders extending the open season for netting in several districts and parts of districts. Owing to the shortage of grilse the results were insignificant. The Order referred only to the year ended 31st December, 1917, and has not been renewed.

EEL FISHERIES.

Judging by the quantity carried over the Irish Railways, the catch of Eels in 1917 was above the average, but not so large as in the previous year.

The Shannon Eel Fisheries, in the prosecution of which some 180 persons were engaged, were reported to be very good. The Bann and Lough Neagh Fisheries were stated to have been good, and it is estimated that eels valued at £15,000 were despatched thence to market. About 60 men were employed by the Bann fishery owners, and some 250 men secured part of their livelihood by long lining for eels in Lough Neagh. This method of eel fishing is also practised to a considerable extent in other Districts, notably Limerick, Galway, and Ballyshannon, and appears to have increased in the year under consideration.

The eel fisheries of the Wexford and Waterford Districts are only exploited to a limited extent. In the Galway and Connemara Districts some 60 persons are employed. About £1,200 was realised for the catch in the Ballina District. The eels captured in Dundalk District by about 30 persons were valued at £580. An improvement was reported from the Drogheda District.

POLLEN FISHERIES.

The Clerk to the Coleraine Board of Conservators reported that the quantity o pollen caught in Lough Neagh was much less than in the previous year. The fish were, however, very large and of fine quality, and in some instances realised very high prices in the English Markets, to which the greater portion of the catch was sent. The falling off in the amount taken was partly due to a scarcity of pollen, and partly to the fact that many of the local fishermen devoted their energies solely to long line fishing for eels. Perch were also captured in large numbers, and the fishing season on Lough Neagh was, taken as a whole, a most satis actory one.

The practice of baiting eel lines with pollen fry still, unfortunately, continues.

There were issued in the Coleraine Fishery District 77 pollen trammel net and 121 pollen draft net licences, yielding a revenue to the Conservators of £258 10s. 0d.

Pollen taken in Lough Ree appeared for the first time in Railway returns, but the manner of their capture has not transpired.

COARSE FRESHWATER FISH.

With a view to securing an addition to the food supply by an increase in the quantity of coarse fish captured in fresh waters, the Department moved the Food Controller to confer certain powers on them to relax legal restrictions on methods of capture in inland waters. The Freshwater Fish (Ireland) Order 1917, was made by the Ministry of Food with this object.

A Committee was appointed to advise and assist the Department in effecting and marketing an increased supply of coarse fish and eels from Irish lakes and rivers. It consists of the following members:—Lieut. E. G. Pery-Knox-Gore, R.N.V.R. (Chairman); Sir Thos. H. Grattan Esmonde, Bart., M.P., D.L.; Rev. T. A. Finlay, M.A., S.J. (Member of the Board of Technical Instruction); J. E. Godfrey, Esq., J.P.; Richard Power, Esq., J.P.; J. Harper Scaife, Esq., LL.B., B.L., Superintendent of the Quit Rent Office (H. M. Woods. Forests and Land Revenues); J. G. Skipton, Esq., A.M.Inst.C.E.; E. W. L. Holt. Esq.. Chief Inspector of Fisheries, and C. Green, Esq., Inspector of Fisheries, Mr. G. McKnight was appointed Secretary.

Schemes were inaugurated in connection with Loughs Derg, Corrib, Erne, &c. The results achieved in Lough Derg were small owing to various factors which militated against the success of the efforts made. The operations on Lough Erne proved very successful, and the output from Lough Corrib was considerable.

Large quantities of shad, pike, perch, &c., were also taken in the Blackwater Fishery at Lismore by the owner's salmon netsmen acting under conditions laid down in an Order made by the Department.

These operations revealed the presence in the Blackwater system of true roach, hitherto unknown in Ireland. Elsewhere in this country the fish commonly called "roach," is, so far as has been ascertained, really a rudd. Dace also exist in the Blackwater and apparently in no other Irish river.

In some 30 cases the Department relaxed legal restrictions on inland fishing to promote an increased capture of coarse fish, but owing to the difficulty of procuring nets expeditiously, it was, unfortunate y, not possible in many instances to utilise fully the facilities accorded.

SCIENTIFIC REPORTS.

Many scientific and other reports have been received during the year and this opportunity is taken of thanking those who placed the valuable information they contain at the disposal of the Department.

MEMBERS OF THE STAFF SERVING WITH H. M. NAVAL AND MILITARY FORCES.

We deeply regret to record the death in action in France on the 10th October, 1918, of Corporal M. E. Brown, 6th Battalion, Royal Dublin Fusiliers, Temporary Clerk. Captain J. A. Watts and Second Lieutenant Gourlay, Second Division Clerks, were captured by the enemy but have been released. Lieutenant A. M. Ewen, Second Division Clerk, has been promoted to the rank of Captain, and Mr. A. C. Kelly, Temporary Clerk, to that of Sergeant. Lieutenant G. P. Farran, Assistant Inspector of Fisheries, transferred in April last to the British West India Regiment, was invalided for a time from the Palestine front, but has since happily recovered. Lieutenant P. Duane, R.N.R., who has been serving in the Dover Patrol, and Engineer Sub-Lieutenant R. A. Kearon, R.N.R., have been mentioned in despatches.

APPENDIX No. 5.

ABSTRACT of BY-LAWS, ORDERS, &c., which have come into force since the date of the Report for the year 1916.

TIDAL AND FRESHWATER BOUNDARIES OF RIVERS.

River Carrowbeg or Westport River .- Dated 6th April, 1918.

Defining the boundary between the tidal and fresh-water portions of the River Carrowbeg or Westport River in the No. 10¹ or Ballinakill District to be the weir or waterfall at the outlet of Westport House Lake.

River Moyour .- Dated 30th April, 1918.

Defining the boundary between the tidal and fresh-water portions of the River Moyour in the No. 10² or Bangor District to be the footbridge at the easternmost point of that part of the townland of Knockasproha, which lies to the north of the River Moyour, in the parish of Kilmeena, barony of Burrishoole, and County of Mayo.

Dunglow River and Rivers flowing into Sea from Lough Meela and Maghery Lough.—Dated 7th March, 1918.

Defining the boundary between the tidal and fresh-water portions of the Dunglow River to be an imaginary straight line drawn across the River in a true N.W. and S.E. direction, 700 feet down stream of the western face of the bridge in the town of Dunglow, measured in the centre of the stream.

Defining the boundary between the tidal and fresh-water portions of the River flowing into the Sea from Lough Meela to be an imaginary straight line across stream parallel with and at a distance downstream of 100 feet from the western face of the bridge carrying the road from Dunglow through the townland of Glashbeggan to Burtonport.

Defining the boundary between the tidal and fresh-water portions of the River flowing into the Sea from Maghery Lough to be an imaginary straight line drawn along the seaward face of the causeway which crosses the outlet of the Lough.
