TO

Extend the Powers of the Department of Agriculture and other Industries and Technical Instruction for Ireland in the matter of the Development of Tourist Traffic, and to amend the Agriculture and Technical Instruction (Ireland) Act, 1899. A.D. 1902.

BE it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

- 5 **1.** The expression "the purposes of agriculture and other
" rural industries " contained in section thirty, sub-section (1) of
the Agriculture and Technical Instruction (Ireland) Act, 1899,
shall include the purpose of the development of the tourist traffic.
- 10 **2.** The expression "technical instruction or for any other
" purpose for which they are authorised " contained in section
nineteen, sub-section (3) of the Agriculture and Technical Instruc-
tion (Ireland) Act, 1899, shall include the purpose of the
development of the tourist traffic in urban districts.
- 15 **3.** This Act may be cited as the Agriculture and Technical
Instruction (Ireland) Amendment Act, 1902, and shall extend to
Ireland only.
