TO

Provide for the Payment of Jurors in Ireland.

A.D. 1896.

BE it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1. This Act may be cited for all purposes as the Payment of Short title. Jurors (Ireland) Act, 1896.
  - 2. This Act shall extend to Ireland only.

Application

- 3. In the construction of this Act the following words shall have Definitions. the meanings herein-after assigned to them :-
- "County" shall include county of a city, county of a town, and 10 the city and county of Londonderry.
  - "Sheriff" shall include under-sheriff.
  - "Common juror" shall include all jurors summoned for the purpose of trying common jury issues, civil and criminal, at any court of justice.
  - "Grand jury" shall include any body empowered to make presentments for a county.

4. Common jurors shall be entitled to the following remuneration Remunerafor their services; that is to say,

Every juror residing within a radius of ten statute miles from the jurors. 20 court-house to which he is summoned to attend as a juror shall be paid at the rate of five shillings for each day or portion of a day he shall be necessarily in attendance.

Every juror residing outside a radius of ten statute miles from such court-house shall be paid at the rate of five shillings for each day or portion of a day he shall be necessarily in attendance, together with the amount of his second-class railway fare from and to his residence, and threepence per mile each way for that portion of his journey where there is no railway available.

Such distance shall be determined by reference to the Ordnance map.

Duties of sheriffs.

5. It shall be the duty of the sheriff to call the panel of jurors each morning immediately before the sitting of the court, and to keep a roll of the names of such jurors, and to enter therein their 5 attendances, and to give to each juror entitled thereto (upon application made) a certificate (in the form in the schedule hereto) of the amount of the remuneration to which he is entitled, not later than six days after the determination of the sitting of the court. Provided always, that no juror shall be entitled to remuneration for 10 any day upon which he shall have failed to answer his name when called in court, unless it is otherwise directed by the presiding judge. Every juror shall, before receiving such certificate, be required by the sheriff to make a declaration in the form set forth in the schedule hereto. The sheriff is hereby authorised to take and 15 receive such declaration, and if any such declaration shall be false or untrue in any material particular, the person wilfully making such false declaration shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanour, and further shall, on summary conviction thereof before one or more justices, be adjudged to pay a penalty of twenty pounds, and 20 in default of paying same, to be imprisoned for a period not exceeding three calendar months with hard labour.

Duties of clerks of the Crown and peace.

6. The clerk of the Crown and peace, or clerk of the Crown, or the clerk of the peace (where the offices of clerk of the Crown and clerk of the peace have not been amalgamated) shall, on receiving 25 from such juror such certificate, give to such juror an order (in the form set forth in the schedule hereto) on the treasurer of the county, for the payment of the amount set forth therein, and such amount shall be paid by the treasurer of the county in which the court shall be held, and he is hereby authorised and required to pay 30 the same to the person named in such order out of the unappropriated funds in bank to the credit of the county. Where it is the duty of the clerk of the Crown and peace, or clerk of the peace, to summon the jurors for any court, the duties of the sheriff under this Act shall be discharged by, and the remuneration and expenses 35 payable (as herein-after set forth) to the sheriff in respect thereof shall be payable to, the clerk of the Crown and peace, or clerk of the peace, as the case may be.

Grand juries to present for remuneration and expenses.

7. The grand jury of every county is hereby required from time to time at the next ensuing assizes or presenting term, without 40 previous application at presentment sessions or otherwise, to present to be raised and levied off the county at large such sums as shall

be necessary for providing the above-mentioned jurors remuneration, A.D. 1896. and also to present to be raised and levied off the county at large for the purpose of defraying the remuneration and expenses of the sheriff and clerk of the Crown and peace, or clerk of the Crown, or 5 clerk of the peace attending the execution of this Act the sums following:-To the sheriff, a sum equal to one shilling in respect of each certificate and one guinea for each day of his attendance under the provisions of this Act at the sittings of the court aforesaid; and to the clerk of the Crown and peace, or clerk of the 10 Crown, or clerk of the peace, a sum equal to one shilling in respect of each order given by him to each juror; and such sums shall be paid to the sheriff and clerk of the Crown and peace, or clerk of the Crown, or clerk of the peace, as the case may be, by the treasurer of the county, in the first instance, out of the unappropriated funds 15 in bank to the credit of the county.

8.
