## Shortening the Time of Prescription in certain Cases in Ireland.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the Second and Third Years of the Reign of King William the Fourth, Chapter Seventy-one, Provisions were made for shortening the Time of Prescription in certain Cases, and it is expedient that the Provisions of the said Act should be extended to Ireland: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, as follows :

I. The Provisions of the said Act of the Second and Third Years of the Reign of King William the Fourth, Chapter Seventy-one, shall from and after the *First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine* extend and apply to Ireland.
