TO

Regulate the Practice in Registry Courts in Ireland.

A.D. 1879.

WHEREAS it is desirable to amend the law regulating the practice in Registry Courts in Ireland:

Be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited for all purposes as the Registry Courts (Ireland) Amendment Act, 1879. Short title.

2. This Act shall apply to Ireland only. Limitation of Act.

10 3. This Act shall commence and take effect on and from the first day of September one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine. Commencement of Act.

4. So much of the Act passed in the thirteenth and fourteenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, chapter sixty-nine, intitled "An Act to amend the laws which regulate the qualification
15 " and registration of parliamentary voters in Ireland, and to alter " the law relating to immediate lessors of premises to the poor in " certain boroughs," as declares that at the holding of any court under the said Act no party or other person should appear or be attended or heard by counsel, shall be repealed. Repeal of certain part of the 56th section of 13 & 14 Vict. c. 69.
